This was a traumatic process, especially in rural areas. The French state carefully avoids any religious recognition. The Church was badly hurt and lost half its priests. In the long run, however, it gained autonomy for the French State no longer had a voice in choosing bishops. The First World War was a disaster for France, even though the country was ultimately a victor. At first many welcomed the war to avenge the humiliation of defeat and loss of territory to Germany following the Franco-Prussian War. However very high losses and almost no gain on the Western Front change opinions of the war. A significant part of the male workforce was killed or disabled and a large part of the country and industry destroyed. When the Second World War was declared there was little enthusiasm and much dread in France at the prospect of enduring another major war. With British troops fleeing France an atmosphere of humiliation and defeat swept over the country. On the other hand, the French Resistance conducted sabotage operations inside German-occupied France. To support the Allied invasion of Normandy in June , various groups increased their sabotage and guerilla attacks. Since the end of WWII France went through a period of reconstruction and prosperity came back with the development of industry. The Fifth Republic to the present emerged from the collapse of the French Fourth Republic and replaced the prior parliamentary government with a semi-presidential system. France began the process of decolonisation after a rise in nationalism following WWII. France would play a role in what would eventually become the European Union. In , France was a republic with a President elected for a 5-year term officially the French Republic and some would describe it as a "Unitary semi-presidential and constitutional republic". Some current main issues are the further integration of the country into the EU and the adoption of common standards for the economy, defence, immigrant rights, and so on. This has meant that the guarantees for freedom of religion have been curtailed for faith groups in France. The landward side was protected by the River Paillon , which was later covered over and is now the tram route towards the Acropolis. Engravings suggest that the port area was also defended by walls. Under Monoprix in Place de Garibaldi are excavated remains of a well-defended city gate on the main road from Turin. Conquered in by the armies of the First French Republic , the County of Nice continued to be part of France until ; but after that date it reverted to the Kingdom of Piedmont-Sardinia. The cession was ratified by a regional referendum: Giuseppe Garibaldi , born in Nice, opposed the cession to France, arguing that the ballot was rigged by the French. Many Italians from Nizza then moved to the Ligurian towns of Ventimiglia , Bordighera and Ospedaletti , [13] giving rise to a local branch of the movement of the Italian irredentists which considered the re-acquisition of Nice to be one of their nationalist goals. By the s more bus connections were added in the area. The circuit started along the waterfront just south of the Jardin Albert I, then headed westward along the Promenade des Anglais followed by a hairpin turn at the Hotel Negresco to come back eastward and around the Jardin Albert I before heading again east along the beach on the Quai des Etats-Unis. After July and the establishment of the Vichy Regime , antisemitic aggressions accelerated the exodus, starting in July and continuing through On 26 August , Jews of foreign origin were rounded up by the Laval government and interned in the Auvare barracks. Of these, were deported to Drancy internment camp on 31 August In November German troops moved into most of unoccupied France, but Italian troops moved into a smaller zone including Nice. A certain ambivalence remained among the population, many of whom were recent immigrants of Italian ancestry. However, the resistance gained momentum after the Italian surrender in when the German army occupied the former Italian zone. Reprisals intensified between December and July , when many partisans were tortured and executed by the local Gestapo and the French Milice. Nice was also heavily bombarded by American aircraft in preparation for the Allied landing in Provence dead or wounded and more than people homeless and famine ensued during summer American paratroopers entered the city on 30 August and Nice was finally liberated. The consequences of the war were heavy: Two men dominated this

period: Under their leadership, there was extensive urban renewal, including many new constructions. These included the convention centre, theatres, new thoroughfares and expressways. The arrival of the Pieds-Noirs , refugees from Algeria after independence, also gave the city a boost and somewhat changed the make-up of its population and traditional views. Later arrested in Uruguay in , he was extradited back to France in , convicted of several counts of corruption and associated crimes and sentenced to imprisonment. On 16 October , a landslide and an undersea slide caused two tsunamis that hit the western coast of Nice; these events killed between 8 and 23 people. *Another place worth mentioning is the small street parallel to the Promenade des Anglais, leading from Nice's downtown, beginning at Place Masséna and running parallel to the promenade in the direction of the airport for a short distance of about 4 blocks.*
