As a Navy Reservist, he was recalled to the service during the Korean War, Hingle began acting in college, and after graduating, he moved to New York and studied at the American Theatre Wing. In , he became a member of the Actors Studio and this led to his first Broadway show, *End as a Man*. In , he played Benjamin Franklin in the Roundabout Theatre revival of the musical , with Brent Spiner, Hingles first film role was an uncredited part as bartender Jock in *On the Waterfront*. Later in his career, he was known for playing judges, police officers and he was a guest star on the early NBC legal drama *Justice*, based on case histories of the Legal Aid Society of New York, which aired in the s. Another notable role was as the father of Warren Beattys character in *Splendor in the Grass*, which was directed by Elia Kazan, Hingle was widely known for portraying the father of Sally Fields title character Norma Rae. Chapman in seven episodes of the TV series *Gunsmoke*, and Col. Tucker in the movie *Gunsmoke, To the Last Man*. In , he appeared in the police series *Stone* with Dennis Weaver. He played Commissioner Gordon in the film *Batman* and its three sequels and he is one of only two actors to appear in the four *Batman* films from to , the other is Michael Gough 3. He also acted out the role in *Sword of Justice*. He may be best remembered on television for playing Jack Ewing in the hit soap opera *Dallas* from and he also played Wesley Harper on the short lived TV series soap opera *Paper Dolls*. While working on *Another World* in , Rambo learned that he was infected with HIV and he quit the series shortly thereafter, and retired from acting. Rambo then publicly announced that he was HIV positive, and revealed that he was bisexual, Rambo died in at the age of 52 of complications from AIDS.

Elmer Bernstein

Elmer Bernstein was an American composer and conductor who is best known for his many film scores. He was not related to the composer and conductor Leonard Bernstein. Within the world of music, they were distinguished from each other by the use of the nicknames Bernstein West. They pronounced their last names differently, Elmer pronounced his, and she took him to play some of his improvisations for composer Aaron Copland, who was encouraging and selected Israel Citkowitz as a teacher for the young boy. His theme for *The Magnificent Seven* is also familiar to television viewers, Bernstein also provided the score to many of the short films of Ray and Charles Eames. One of Bernsteins tunes has since gained a place in U. Along with many in Hollywood, Bernstein faced censure during the McCarthy era of the early s, Bernstein was called by the House Un-American Activities Committee when it was discovered that he had written some

music reviews for a Communist newspaper. John Landis grew up near Bernstein, and befriended him through his children, years later, he requested that Bernstein compose the music for National Lampoons Animal House, over the studios objections. He explained to Bernstein that he thought that Bernsteins score, playing it straight as if the comedic Delta frat characters were actual heroes, the opening theme to the movie is based upon a slight inversion of a secondary theme from Brahms Academic Festival Overture. When Martin Scorsese announced that he was re-making Cape Fear, Bernstein adapted Bernard Herrmanns original score to the new film, Bernstein leapt at the opportunity to work with Scorsese, and to pay homage to Herrmann. Bernstein had previously conducted Herrmanns original unused score for Alfred Hitchcocks Torn Curtain, in addition, Bernstein was a professor at the University of Southern Californias Thornton School of Music and conductor of the San Fernando Valley Symphony in the early s 5. An Emmy Award nominee, Huddleston had a television career. Huddleston was born in Vinton, Virginia, the son of Ismay Hope and he was briefly an officer in the United States Air Force before beginning his formal education in acting at the prestigious American Academy of Dramatic Arts. Huddleston attended Fork Union Military Academy for high school and is listed among the prominent alumni. Known mainly as a actor, Huddleston starred in the title role of s big-budget film Santa Claus, The Movie. He appeared in an episode of the short-lived series The New Land. â€” Jay Robinson was an American actor specializing in character roles. He became interested in acting after discovering a scrapbook of his mothers dance career and his first film role was as the notorious Emperor Caligula in The Robe, which he reprised in Demetrius and the Gladiators. He also appeared in Born Again, the adaptation of the book of the same title, about Watergate figure. Before retiring, Robinson was the host and narrator for the Discovery Channel special Beyond Bizarre from to and his new-found celebrity after appearing in The Robe and its sequel Demetrius and the Gladiators reportedly went to his head, and he became extremely difficult to work with. In addition the actor began experimenting recklessly with drugs. He was arrested and booked in for possession of narcotics and after a trial sentenced to a year in jail, his conviction was overturned on appeal, while free on bail, the incident and resulting bad press ruined his acting career. After scraping up work outside the entertainment industry as a cook and landlord, he recovered from his drug addiction, Robinson credited letters of encouragement from friend Bette Davis with helping him find the strength to overcome his problems. She helped him get his first film role in 13 years, Robinson was married twice, to Pauline Flowers from until her death in and to Gloria Casas since until his death. In a career spanning four decades, he appeared in numerous films, Burkley was born in Los Angeles, California, the son of Imogene and Henry Burkley. He grew up in Grand Prairie, Texas, and graduated from Texas Christian University, in his s and s appearances, Burkley was most recognizable for his large 6 ft 3 in and lb frame, scruffy beard, and Southern accent. However, in appearances, he lost a significant amount of weight and had a less slovenly appearance. Corporation, a struggle ensues, Sir Harry is killed, and Cat is sentenced to be hanged on the gallows. With Sir Harry dead, there's no hope for Wolf City's future, as the noose is placed around her neck, Uncle Jed appears, again dressed as a preacher, and cuts the rope just as the trapdoor is opened. They act as a Greek chorus, intermittently narrating the story through verses of *The Ballad of Cat Ballou*, the film was director Elliot Silverstein's second feature film, and his relationship with producer Harold Hecht while filming was not smooth. Ann-Margret was the first choice for the role but her manager turned it down without letting the actress know. Ann-Margret wrote in her autobiography that she would have wanted the part, among others, Kirk Douglas allegedly turned down the role of Shelleen. In a final confrontation, Wade and Luke, at the edge of a cliff, bait the car into running straight at them, then jump aside as it goes over the cliff.
