In this 19th century work by the French painter Jean-Francois Millet, a farming couple prays the Angelus at dusk. The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary. And she conceived of the Holy Spirit. Behold the handmaid of the Lord. Be it done unto me according to thy word. And the Word was made Flesh. And dwelt among us. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Through the same Christ Our Lord. Although the Angelus has been traditionally said three times daily, at 6 am, noon and 6 pm, you can pray it at anytime! It is still accompanied by the ringing of a bell the Angelus bell in some places such as Vatican City and parts of Germany and Ireland. The Regina Coeli prayer which may also be sung as a hymn replaces the Angelus during the Easter season. The Angelus reminds us of the Annunciation shown in this famous rendition at left by Fra Angelico , when the angel Gabriel appeared to Mary with great, if somewhat startling , news! The lines that follow about being made worthy of the promises of Christ are also found in the Rosary and tie in well with what follows: Jesus loved us enough to die for us so that we might live with Him eternally! We are blessed in that we can ask both God and His Blessed Mother for their assistance on our journey towards Eternal Life!

Description[ edit ] Detail of the icon, showing the Archangel Michael. The Blessed Virgin Mary “ wearing a dress of dark red, representing the Passion of Jesus, with a blue mantle, representing her perpetual virginity , and cloaked veil, which represents her pure modesty. The subject shows Mary looking towards the faithful, while pointing at her son, Jesus Christ who is frightened by the instruments of crucifixion and is depicted with a fallen sandal. The left side is Saint Michael Archangel “ carrying the lance and sponge of the crucifixion of Jesus. On the right side is Saint Gabriel Archangel carrying a 3-bar cross used by Popes at the time and nails. The Virgin Mary has a star on her forehead signifying her role as Star of the Sea while the cross on the side has been claimed as referring to the Greek monastery which produced the icon. Byzantine depictions of the Blessed Virgin Mary in art have three stars, one star each on the shoulder and one on the forehead. This type of icon is called Hodegetria , where Mary is pointing to her Son, known as a Theotokos of the Passion. The veil and her face itself are rounded, indicating holiness. The size of the mother is also out of proportion to her son, a deliberate intent by the artist Mary as larger than life. The icon has a gold background on a walnut panel, believed to be from Crete. The gold background represents the Kingdom of God. The icon was cleaned and restored once in and again in the year Pious legends[ edit ] Popular legends claim that the icon to be a true copy of a painting that according to legend was painted by Saint Luke using the meal table of the Holy Family in Nazareth , and in Eastern Orthodox tradition was often identified with the Hodegetria icon, [6] and consider it to be a miraculous imprint of the Virgin Mary both in the Latin and Orthodox communities. This belief is common in many Hodegetria icons who have similar claims of Lucan legends. Origin and discovery[ edit ] Close-up of the Archangel Gabriel. The earliest written account of the image comes from a Latin and Italian plaque placed in the church of San Matteo in Via Merulana where it was first venerated by the public in The writer of the icon is unknown, but according to a parchment attached to the painting that accompanied the icon, it was stolen by a merchant sailing to Rome from the island of Crete. The Keras Kardiotissas Monastery is regarded as the monastery from which the icon was stolen. The picture was then popularly called the Madonna di San Matteo. Among the several churches demolished during the French occupation was San Matteo in Via Merulana, which housed the icon. Eusebius, then later set it up on a side altar in the Church of Santa Maria in Posterula. In January , the Redemptorist priests purchased Villa Caserta in Rome along the Via Merulana and converted it into their headquarters. Alphonsus Liguori at that location. The Redemptorists were thus established on the Via Merulana, not knowing that it had once been the site of the Church of San Matteo and shrine of the once-famous icon. Present caretaker[ edit ] Detail of the hands of the virgin. The same Pontiff directed the Augustinian friars to surrender the icon to the Redemptorist priests, on condition that the Redemptorists must supply the Augustinians with another picture of Our Lady of Perpetual Help or a good copy of the icon in exchange as a gesture of goodwill. Pope Pius IX instructions to the Redemptorists were: Mary Major; the Redemptorists shall replace it with another adequate picture. On 23 June , the image was given a Canonical Coronation by the Dean of the Vatican Chapter in a solemn and official recognition of the Marian icon under that title. The original icon remains under the care of the Redemptorist Fathers at the Church of St. Alphonsus with the latest restoration of the icon having taken place in In , the icon underwent restoration by the Polish painter Leopold Nowotny The Redemptorist Order entered into contract with the Technical Department at the Vatican Museum to restore the icon and prevent further fungal damage to the icon. The restoration process involved X-ray , infra-red scanning, technical analysis of the paint and ultra-violet testing along with a Carbondent which placed the icon between the year Artistic analysis of the icon revealed that the facial structure of the icon was altered due to previous overpainting, resulting in a combination of "oriental and occidental" features of the image. Pope John Paul II once said Mass at the shrine as cardinal , and later prayed before the icon during his first pastoral visit to the country in February All Catholic churches and chapels in the Philippines have a replica of the icon, often enshrined on a side altar.

Copies of the icon are also commonly displayed in houses, businesses, and public transport. Devotees today still use the same Novena booklet first published by Irish Redemptorist priests, who introduced the icon and its devotion to the Philippines in the s. The Filipino Diaspora have also kept observance of the Wednesday Novena, holding novena services in their respective parishes overseas. Monthly devotion is also observed; every 27th, chapels conduct monthly procession of the image of the Blessed Mother in their respective areas. The original image can still be seen in a chapel somewhere in the parish where Latin inscriptions about the dedication of the holy image can be found at the back. In , the son of Marquis of Rioflorido, Jose Carlos fell ill with pleurisy. His mother, the noble lady Desamparado Fontes fed him a silk fabric cloth touched to the icon of Perpetual Help in Rome which resulted in an instantaneous healing later claimed to be miraculous. As a token of thanksgiving, the lady Fontes officially donated funds to begin the Confraternity of Almoradi. On its 50th anniversary in , a public coronation of this image was held and the crowns were made by Santero artist Jose David by the town mayor and its authorities. In addition to this, Our Lady of Perpetual Help is the designated the national patron saint of Haiti.

Mother Maria Concepcion Zuniga Lopez. The divine mission of Rev. Mother Maria began on October 3, 1863, when she was 12 years old. At that time, public worship was suspended in Mexico due to the religious persecution [of the Cristeros] Ed. On that day, in the parish church of her home town of Ocotlan, Jalisco, the crucifix came to life, and Christ spoke to the future foundress of the Minims from His cross, inviting her to share the sorrow of being hidden, abandoned, forgotten, despised, persecuted, and hated without cause. I want to follow Thee down the path to Calvary. Nail me to Thy cross with Thee. In exchange I only ask for one thing: May all souls love Thee. The young woman suffered greatly on considering the number of souls that were lost eternally and she longed to embrace them all in the Heart of Jesus. Our Lord wanted her to offer herself in union with Divine Justice to save souls and to teach others this way by founding a religious Order that would have as its goal the formation of victim souls who offered themselves in atonement for the world. The realization of the foundation of the Order of victims became a reality and was born to the Church June 24, 1863, with the approval of H. Bishop Manuel Fulcheri y Pietrasanta of holy memory. The work that Mother Conchita initiated within the Franciscan family—living in poverty, obedience, and chastity—is a work at the service of the Church to gather souls. Its apostolates consist in giving religious conferences to women with the purpose of fostering the practice of virtue, of enlightening souls which are confused or in error, of arousing piety and religious fervor in women and teaching them their duties before God and society. It organizes groups for catechism and feminine Catholic activities. Besides publishing a magazine titled Estrella, it also prints various bulletins to send rays of light into homes and families. However, the most intense and beneficial of their apostolates is prayer and perpetual adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. During hours of intimacy with Jesus in the Sacred Host, they inflame themselves with great zeal for the salvation of souls. At present there are 33 Sisters in the single Community which makes up the Order of which two of its members are from the US. Mary of Lourdes is from Lawrence, Massachusetts, and Sr. Mary of the Holy Spirit is from Kirkwood, Missouri. One other Sister is from Buenos Aires, Argentina, and the rest are from different provinces throughout Mexico. Mother foundress Maria died in 1900. The Order is of the great Franciscan tree whose seed is that of St. In order to strengthen the life of prayer in the Community and compensate for the forgetfulness of the Divine Guest on our Catholic altars, the Order is dedicated to perpetual adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. The Sisters worship Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament by perpetual and uninterrupted adoration. They unite themselves to Him as eternal Mediator between heaven and earth, between Divine Justice and the guilty world. They offer themselves in atonement with Him, like Him, and for Him. The Minims take the same three vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience that bind all religious at the time of temporary profession. But at the time of their perpetual profession, they rebind themselves to their special charism by pronouncing a fourth vow of "victim" which characterizes the Order. This vow of victimhood is threefold. Firstly, that the Minim be a victim in union with the Divine Word Incarnate, zealous for the glory of God and salvation of souls, repairing for the harm sin brings upon the world and satisfying the Divine Justice to transform It into blessing and mercy. Secondly, that she adore Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, compensating for the failure of dissipated souls to love and console the Sacred Heart. Lastly, that she offer herself in childlike abandonment to Our Lady and propagate devotion to her to others. The qualifications for entry are that aspirants must be at least 18 years of age, in good mental and physical health, and a daughter of a legitimate marriage. She must have a general knowledge of Spanish, that is, to be able to converse simply in the language and to understand it when spoken to her. Aspirants must have a strong desire to love God and save souls and be capable of suffering gladly the trials of holy poverty. She is not obliged to pay a dowry or to have finished her formal schooling. The postulancy for the Minim is nine months, the first three months of which she wears a gray habit followed in the last six months with the wearing of a brown habit symbolizing poverty. On the

day of her clothing as a novice, the aspirant wears a white wedding habit. For the two years of her novitiate, she wears the dark, deep-red habit of the Work of Atonement signifying that she is inflamed by ardent charity as that of the inflamed and reddened Sacred Heart. The short turquoise head-veil she dons at this time symbolizes the theological virtue of hope that enlivens her soul. Once the two-year novitiate has ended, the novice makes temporary vows, renewing them annually for five years, during which time she wears a blue veil reaching to the middle of her back. This new veil represents the veil of Mary, symbolizing that the religious should be clothed with aspirations for Heaven. After renewing her temporary vows for five consecutive years, she is eligible to make her perpetual vows and becomes a professed Minim clothed with the blue veil reaching to her feet. The Minims consider themselves mothers of suffering humanity united to Jesus, the Divine Mediator. They mourn the wounds of the world, bearing in mind the spiritual and temporal needs of all. They seek never to avoid any sacrifice since it is the duty of the Minim to practice immolation in a total self-surrender to Divine Justice, an attribute they especially honor. In this they imitate Christ Who came to earth precisely to offer Himself up to this Divine Justice as Victim for the redemption of the world. Since she is considered their "Superior General," they beg for her counsel on every occasion. The members of the Order strive to make this Marian devotion stand out as a tribute to the Blessed Mother. They take refuge in her motherly embrace to obtain perfect union with Jesus, whom she carries in her arms. The devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus consists in the veneration of the physical heart of Jesus. Since the goal of the Work of Atonement is to console this Divine Heart, the members participate in His internal Passion by means of the Holy Eucharist where He mystically perpetuates His victimhood. Joseph, the spouse of Mary and head of the Holy Family, is childlike, with a spirit of total confidence in his patronage. They commend to him in particular the cultivation of the interior life in their souls. The principal goal of the Order is the sanctification of its members. Each member considers what it means to be a true victim soul, that is, a faithful imitator of the virtues Jesus taught us by His charity and the immolation of His Heart hidden in the Holy Eucharist. They try to compensate for the sensuality and impenitence of those who need atonement, baptized or not. Penance is the only means to cleanse the soul and, since this Order is of atonement, it loves penance and practices it with a joyful spirit. The Franciscan Minims of the Perpetual Help of Mary commend themselves to your prayers so that they might fulfill the mission Our Lord has given them, and that there be awakened in souls a love for the Divine Justice. Our Lord wants to be loved in His justice and asks for souls to offer themselves as victims who render their love, confidence, and self-abandonment to Him so He will shower mercy upon the world for the salvation of souls. These words of Rev. Mother Foundress best identify the spirit of the members of the Order: I have never esteemed the goods of the earth as valuable. Heaven has been my only desire since my childhood; Heaven for my soul and for the souls of those I love. And the souls I love are so numerous that my spiritual thirst cannot be quenched. Five decades one complete Mystery: Joyful, Sorrowful, or Glorious should be recited each day. This devotion and the wonderful promises connected with it were revealed by the Blessed Virgin at Fatima, a small village in Portugal. Our lady appeared to three children there in , and one of the little girls, Lucy, tells us that Our Lady said: I promise to help at the hour of death, with the graces needed for salvation, whoever on the First Saturday of five consecutive months shall: Confess and Receive Communion. Keep me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen Mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to me.
