

## Chapter 1 : Beginner Level Classic Repertoire - Piano World Piano & Digital Piano Forums

Write your journal entries after reading and reflecting on class lectures and discussions, newspaper and magazine articles e. Consider the following questions in writing your journal entry: Are piano lessons limited to one age group or skill level? How, why, or why not? Give a rationale for your answer. How has this course affected your outlook or awareness on music and piano teaching in general? Have you encountered contradictory information about music and piano teaching? Think critically, examine the differing points of view, and state your own opinions on the matter. How has this course affected your outlook on the function and role of piano teachers in American society? Journal 1 is due Monday, Sept. ### Chapter 2 : Learn Piano Online - Piano Lessons with Hoffman Academy

At these tender ages, their attention span is very short. This article presents some fun ways for you to deal with piano students at the beginner level. It is important for the child to get a feel of the instrument they will be learning. Accordingly, the first lesson should not have any fixed syllabus. Let the child randomly hit keys on the piano and hear their sound. You can then step in and explain that the high-pitched sounds come from notes that are placed towards the right side of the keyboard. As the child is still tapping away on the piano, exploring the range of white and black keys, you may point out that the amount of force they use to hit the keys controls the volume of the sound being produced. This is a great introduction to the concept of musical dynamics, and children will be excited to try it out for themselves. Beginners will be fidgety sitting at the piano for more than half an hour, especially since they do not really know how to play the instrument. You need to mix up the lesson; for example, assign some time for them to tap out a rhythm or call them to a whiteboard to introduce the notes. Making the initial few minutes of each lesson fun will get the student comfortable and put them into the right frame of mind to learn something new. Once they are in the mood, they will absorb the technical details much easier. Again, the last part of the lesson should be made interesting, so that the student leaves the class happy, prepared to practice and longing to come back the next time. The mood of the teacher rubs off on the student. If you want them to have fun while learning the piano, you need to show them you are having an equal amount of fun as the teacher. Of course, this does not mean you let them have free rein and let the lesson get out of control. Ultimately, you need to show that you are in charge, but as their friend and guide; always ready to help them when they need you. But it is crucial not to overburden the child on the first few classes, or they may take a dislike to learning the piano! The bottom line is that each student is different, and the best teachers modify their general approach to suit the personality and aptitude of the student.
