

Chapter 1 : Our Pastor - Shalom Missionary Baptist Church

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The congregation was born out of the prayers of people at Resurrection Church, planted by Brad Stephenson 13 years ago. Different churches were adopting unreached people groups for which to pray, and Resurrection Church adopted the Jewish people of North America. Services were held on Saturday mornings as an outreach to Jewish people. Soon thereafter, Beth Sar Shalom took on a life of its own and soon became a church plant. Beth Sar Shalom was formed in an unusual manner. Not so with Beth Sar Shalom. They started by holding public services before developing any core group, because it was not intended to become a congregation. God used the public services to attract a core group made up of people from several communities, including Bowling Green and Glasgow, Kentucky, and Nashville, Tennessee. Beth Sar Shalom holds its weekly service on Saturday mornings, has Jewish-style liturgy, music and dance, and uses terminology to which Jewish people can relate. However, there is often little emphasis on discipleship or reproduction. If there is no substance beyond outward Jewish traditions, after two or three years many move on to the next unique thing that blows into town. For example, Beth Sar Shalom prayed for people to come who had experience in Christian education. Subsequently, God brought in three families who have taught in a Christian school for more than 12 years. The congregation felt that the addition of a guitarist would significantly enhance the worship. As a bonus, he also plays mandolin, violin, bass, drums, various rhythm instruments and even the banjo and harmonica! The teams would take the initiative for evangelism in their areas as well as minister to the needs of each other. Prayer for specific Jewish unbelievers and for those in the group will be central to each team. My parents saw this as the greatest tragedy of their lives. They thought my children would grow up hating Jews. They felt an obligation to raise children who would perpetuate their Jewish heritage. Now they felt they had failed their people. It was an us-and-them mentality and I became one of them. But that relationship has been restored. The local newspaper has given Beth Sar Shalom positive front-page coverage on a number of occasions. Radio stations have aired positive interviews. Sacks believes the congregation now has a foundation of core people and a platform for ministry. So, despite the fact that vandals struck their building, they could not strike at the spirit of the people of Beth Sar Shalom. Pray for Pastor Jonathan Sacks and the congregation as they continue to proclaim Messiah Yeshua to the Jewish communities that surround them.

Remember the prophet Isaiah called the Messiah the Prince of Peace. In Hebrew, the word for Peace is Shalom. To wish for the Shalom of God is to wish to see all creation functioning as it should, working together in perfect harmony for its intended purpose. This Shalom is what we hope for and witness to as the Church while we wait for Christ to return and bring his peace to whole world. Real harmony can only come from God. It is the Spirit of God in his fullness that equips this Messiah to perfectly understand and display the righteousness and faithfulness of God. The marginalized will be embraced. Where the refugee is safe. Violence will be eradicated. Perfect Shalom, perfect harmony means no person and no-thing will survive at the expense of another. The wicked will in no uncertain terms be dealt with, but the amazing thing here is they are not killed by lightning bolts or armies of angels. We were created in the image of God. This means we are meant to be an image of him, reflecting, displaying, and pointing to his perfect character. Creation is meant to display the glory, or the beauty of God, in all his creative power and energy. They are the sea. We know from the Scriptures that Jesus is a descendant of David. So, Christians have always understood this passage to be about Jesus. And we know that Jesus, because he was God incarnate, was perfectly yielded to the Holy Spirit in a way that no other human being possibly could be. How could any sinful person ever fulfill that Messianic prophecy in Isaiah? Only the sinless Savior Jesus Christ can enact and invite us into this Kingdom. Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand. Imagine what it would look like for us to embrace the marginalized, reject any form of violence or coercion as means of living in the Kingdom, and for our community to be filled with the knowledge of the Lord. How do we begin to live out this kind of harmony, this kind of Shalom together? A life of thankful praise overflows into perfect harmony. Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God. Because when we treat one another as Christ has treated us, we must operate in submission to the Spirit. When we treat one another as Christ has treated us, we sacrifice ourselves. When we treat one another as Christ has treated us, the knowledge of the Lord begins to spread beyond us. The Shalom of Christ begins to cover the earth. Do you want to be a part of that? We can live peace on earth now and in the future. All because of Jesus.
