Which means 90 percent of the cars were unsold -- not a good record. Of modern Chevrolet Malibus, five sold, just more than 1 percent. This makes sense to me. It makes no sense to buy an everyday car far away when local dealers or Craigslist might have the duplicate car within driving distance. A spokesman for eBay Motors says that 76 percent of the vehicles sold in the United States went to out-of-state buyers. To be fair, older cars are more affordable. Still, hard-to-find, in-demand newer sports cars sometimes sell well on eBay. The parts section of eBay Motors is also rapidly losing its appeal to me. Not long ago, you could find nearly thousands of new, used or reproduction parts on eBay Motors for even the most obscure cars. EBay used to be gold mine for those trolling the Internet for parts to restore their project cars. Surfing over to eBay was like going to a never-ending garage sale with great new items appearing every minute. Now searching for that rare part is mostly a time-suck. Clicking through the parts listings reveals tens of thousands of generic parts listed automatically from robo-sellers, components with vague descriptions that do not fit or match the vehicles for which they are listed. EBay was great when you could turn on your computer and wade through thousands of items owned by individuals. You never knew what treasure would turn up or how much it would sell for. But eBay decided that businesses and new- and used-car dealers, not individuals, have deeper pockets and can provide a more consistent source of revenue. But the change has made eBay more like a trip to the dollar store.

While sellers like the idea of giving buyers an incentive to shop their wares, some believe holding sales too.

Unlike eBay, where each vendor maintains a separate listings page, Amazon tidily groups its Marketplace sellers by item, hiding away the inferior offers, to showcase the best deals up front. In seller parlance, landing the number-one spot is called "getting the buy box. There are now more than two million sellers on Amazon. The Marketplace started in selling used books. Yet we know so little about who they are. Nearly all of them, companies that were growing by 1, percent or more, had websites that looked a decade out of date. Maybe a few links to products. They build their businesses on platforms--eBay, Walmart. While other platform retailers have identified a niche opportunity and capitalized--search Amazon for horse brushes or pickle ball paddles and you can buy from two other Inc. This upstart has succeeded by selling what most every retailer in the world, Amazon included, already offers. From there, you can see the new World Trade Center, but otherwise the glitz of Manhattan might as well be a thousand miles away. Planes take off and land practically overhead. LaGuardia Airport is across a nearby inlet. The closest neighbor is a vast parking lot jammed with Time Warner Cable vans. Tramunti got the door, and Vagenas was waiting behind his desk, a wary look on his face. Nothing personal, he said--but competitors always try to steal their secrets. One even sent a guy undercover to apply for a packing job, he added, staring at me for an extra beat. Then he cracked a smile. Vagenas introduced me to his partners. Tramunti is an old buddy who grew up a few blocks from his house. Jimmy Mastronardi knows Tramunti and Vagenas from the neighborhood too. Two other guys, Jonathan Webb and his business partner, Adam Berkowitz, joined recently. They are older, in their 40s. The younger guys busted their chops about their age. But really, everybody was busting chops about everything. But the company was considering it. But from there, people buy everything else. A man sat, an air gun in hand, inflating the containers nonstop. As soon as one crackled into shape, he grabbed the next, 15 times a minute. Originally, Vagenas and Tramunti and another friend ran a pharmacy in the South Bronx. When they started selling health and beauty products online in, they thought it could make a nifty side business. Mastronardi soon joined them to help run the numbers. As they hammered out kinks, they discovered that selling on a platform like Amazon was totally different from running their drugstore or even a standalone website. It was also a much bigger opportunity. You could fill a book with all the differences, of course, but the big one was: They could sell whatever they wanted, at whatever price, for whatever period of time. If they want to sell lotion one week and hairspray the next, they can do that. Early on, the guys decided that it would be easiest to offer whatever their suppliers had in stock. When a customer ordered something, they in turn would order it from the supplier, pick it up, and then pack and ship it. Inventory often stays in their warehouse only for a few hours before going right back out the door. The business is less like traditional merchandising than it is like a commodities trader from a bygone era, buying and selling well-known goods and turning a profit on each transaction. Not that any of their family and friends knew the difference, at first. In the platform business, they learned, price is everything. Set a price too high, and Amazon buries it. Setting it too low is worse, earning the buy box and leading to thousands of orders flooding in--and a loss of money on every sale. The conundrum fascinated Tramunti. He toyed with different pricing strategies, figuring out formulas for how much they could charge for certain products and still get the sale. They started getting the buy box--and making money--more often. He and the team had a developer code the tactics into algorithms,

and baked them right into their proprietary software. Now the listings had optimal prices. They called the software the Master Brain. The Pharmapacks guys love the Master Brain. Or the way Pablo Escobar guarded the source of his ultrapure cocaine. He showed me the YouTube clip of the scene in which Johnny Depp, who plays the kingpin drug smuggler in the film, has his product tested by a black-market chemist--who goes gaga over its off-the-charts purity. Sales increased sixfold in a year. Neighbors began complaining about the never-ending stream of UPS and postal trucks. They were also unhappy about the warehouse packers who, in the absence of a decent-size company cafeteria or nearby restaurants, plopped down on their lawns each day to eat lunch. Other marketplace sellers have algorithms. There are now companies that design pricing software for platform vendors: Vendors also need high customer-service ratings to get the buy box. Keeping them that way is a grind, especially when you sell almost 25, different products and ship, orders a month. People get emotional about personal-care products. In July, it came with 10 percent extra. It was a promo! Part of this was growing pains--it took a while to figure out how to fill so many orders fast without screwing up. But complainers are a naturally occurring species in e-commerce, and Pharmapacks now employs 16 customer-service reps, who field almost concerns over the phone and by email every day. They write back to all customer inquiries within 24 hours--one of the key metrics Amazon tracks in its customer-service ratings. Two employees use a software program called Trustpilot to scroll through every 1-, 2-, and 3-star review the company receives and give each of them special attention. Thanks to such micro-advocacy, Pharmapacks had more than 3, low ratings removed in alone. To put that into perspective, Pharmapacks products have been rated more than, times--and its Amazon rating is 4. Each day, the Seller Support group takes down one or more Pharmapacks listings without warning because of customer complaints. One day it was a bottle of Dove Advanced Hair Series Quench Absolute Serum that was listed for fine hair but turned out to be for coarse hair. The manufacturer changed the UPC code, Vagenas said. Another day it was Cold-Eeze Cold Remedy lozenges. But every time I visited, some new toiletry had taken the place of the others on his desk. Uneasy lies the head that wears the crown of 4. No, not like that. Pharmapacks buys from the same established, law-abiding distributors that sell to national chains like Walmart, Costco, and CVS. But ask these distributors where they get the products, and some will give an answer as gruff and dismissive as the vehicular estrangement explanation above. Pharmapacks has agreements with 16 suppliers. Some deal directly with manufacturers. Others get their goods in more circuitous ways. From eBay sellers to Multi-million dollar Startup: You can unsubscribe at anytime. Today we are talking about eBay. Vic, welcome to the show. Thank you for having me, Alex. Jolly good, jolly good. Look, before we get on you talking about Crazylister, I was looking over your career highlights and it struck me that you started off by studying law. Actually what attracted you to law in the first place? That sounds like a strange way for a technologist to start his career. In fact I was studying law and economics. And actually I was drawn to the commerce world while I was a student in my second year. And from that moment on that I kind of, I came to classes with a laptop and I was just running my eBay business from the university basically. So you actually started this when you were an undergraduate? And was that easy to balance, almost being quite a lot of work to try and keep under your belt studying law and running a business? But that sounds like a normal student except you were actually working rather than just lying on the couch watching TV. Oh yeah, not a lot of beach time for me, no. So when you graduated then the business was already up and running and you had something to move into. Is that how it basically went? His name is Max. And we had a small business running by the time I finished my degree, yes. And was that the business that became LGO or was that a different business? So what specifically were you selling with LGO? What was it you backed up on that you actually sell? Our initial breakout was actually with one of the most competitive categories on eBay which is GPS devices for cars. Back at the day before people had smartphones and free GPS devices basically, it was very popular to have a dedicated device for your car, dedicated GPS device. And this was like the first success we saw on eBay. So what year was that then? Oh wow, it was I think, something like that. It also shows how quickly technology has moved on. So supplier, how did you stumble across a supplier for those type of devices? It all started, I mean, we were selling on eBay and it was not a great success. We were grossing out a few hundreds of dollars a month, maybe couple of thousands, nothing really beyond some change for beer. And then I needed a GPS for myself, for my own purposes. Because the listing itself, the way it was designed it conveyed anything but good quality. In fact it still works to this day and it travelled with me through four continents. We will sell the exact same GPS on eBay. We will just wrap it in a much more professional and much more trust-conveying listing design than the Chinese supplier did it. It just shows you that you are really good to just grab an opportunity when you see it and take full advantage of the situation. Oh yeah, I mean he still continued selling on eBay, but we were outselling him as well, but his margin remains the same. So how were you driving those sales? How did you actually manage to penetrate places like eBay Germany? Was it just listing expertise or that you try and support it through advertising or any other techniques? So we had a few assumptions. We are located in Israel and we had all the disadvantages. We could not possibly ever compete on prices, so we could not offer the lowest prices. So shipping could not be a unique valuable position for us neither because shipping from China takes time. Having all of these disadvantages we figured the only advantage we can have over our competition was just, like I said â€" wrapping the exact same item in a much more trust-conveying and in a much more appealing listing. And if you ask why, the answer is because they are deadly focused on the experience, on the design. I mean iPhone is twice or even three times more expensive than any other smartphone on the market, and people still buy them like crazy. Because they convey the notion that it is a better device, a better product with design. And because of that, that expertise in creating that listing, I guess that means that you stayed on the eBay channel. Oh yeah, of course. It was really hard being dependent on one channel. I mean, in terms of a risk as a young company you always try to deriskify your business. So early on we made the decision to expand beyond eBay, and we did, we expanded to Amazon, to Amazon US and the European Amazon sites, and later on to our own web store. So on your profile I was looking at you earlier days on LinkedIn, the growth of the business was very impressive. How

difficult was that? So the growth happened because we were very methodical, we were very process oriented about our business. So we were constantly gathering input from our customers, and this is how we realized how can we make our listings better, what buttons to push, what is it? I mean, if you look at a GPS device, it has tens or even hundreds of different attributes: Screen size, battery life, software, map updates and what not. And we needed, again, being process oriented, we constantly found out how to improve our listings to convey a more and more focused message on what made people to actually buy. Now when growth began and we were a two men show, it was Max and myself, so the first thing we did is to look for optimization solutions. How can we optimize the process? Because if you think about it, the process looks like this, we were getting orders from eBay, from Amazon, from our site that these orders needed to somehow get to our supplier from China, and we needed to pay him his fee, the cost of the GPS device that he needed to actually ship the GPS device to the end customer, and we needed to somehow get the tracking number to update eBay, Amazon and the customer. And back at the day the landscape of multichannel e-commerce solutions, it was very shallow, there was not a lot of offerings out there. And actually failing to find something like that, we hired a software developer and we built our own kind of in-house solution to accommodate our exact needs. So the whole thing was built around your own software, but also the core to that was the supplier itself was actually fulfilling your orders to help manage your costs and the logistic challenges as well. And from time to time he screwed up and we had to cover for this. And I think the most important learning here is that the customer is not to blame. If our suppliers screws up we need to make the customer happy, no matter what. So we were refunding customers, no questions asked. If we were late to deliver an item, whatever, we were focused on making the customers happy even if it meant losing money in the short run, but reputation was above all. There is often no choice, you just simply have to get the customer happy again. Other than that you are just two anonymous guys from Israel trying to ship an item from China to the US and make profit out of it. So LGO, does that still exist today or is that a past business? Oh yeah, it still exists. The business took a brand-new shape and we found a brand-new niche where we focus on for the best five or six years. Those are the stabilizers, the cranes for videographers to stabilize the video. And it still exists, it still works. Max and myself, we do not run it on the day-to-day operations, we have partners who run it. Actually they are your neighbors, the business is being run from London. Crazylister then why, why that shift into software? They were very interested in the tools, in the technology and methodology of what we do. In the first eBay event here in Israel back in, eBay granted us with awards for having the highest conversion rates in the Israeli selling community. We did not even imagine doing this. And we started doing this as the service for other businesses, optimizing the listings for them. And after doing this for a few months, we got a really good understanding of how does it look for other businesses that what we were doing that looked like very trivial for us if this is the process that you need to do. So we realized that this was a new convention for eBay sellers. We could at best serve few hundreds of customers this way, and eBay has 25 million active sellers. So early on we understood that this must be a SaaS solution, software as a service solution. And this was what gave birth to Crazylister. I mean the idea that eBay saw how successful you had been and encouraged you to go and share that knowledge. And, of course, it gave us a lot of authority. And, again, being two anonymous students we found ourselves running the biggest businesses in Israel, chains with hundred of stores, and we were running their ecommerce for them. And we figured that we must make this knowledge and technology affordable and available to the average eBay seller, not only to the biggest businesses. So building the product, building Crazylister. Were you able to fund the development of your own resources or did you have to bring an external funding to do that stuff? We were bootstrapped for at least two and a half years I think, which means that every penny we were making out of LGO we were investing into building Crazylister.

Personally, I was issued a policy violation warning in for a policy that had not yet been enacted and, even worse, had not yet been announced. It is one thing to give pricing incentives and better search placement to favored sellers but it is another thing altogether to allow them to brazenly violate the rules. As a result, eBay members often times give up reporting or harbor deep resentment and frustration. I personally have reported policy violations where no action is taken. Nothing was ever done. They have learned that eBay does not take lower level policy violations seriously and even higher level policy violation notices are issued rarely.
