These losses caused Nixon to contemplate leaving politics once he had served out his term. Eisenhower was unable to perform his duties for six weeks. The 25th Amendment to the United States Constitution had not yet been proposed, and the Vice President had no formal power to act. In a December meeting, Eisenhower proposed that Nixon not run for reelection in order to give him administrative experience before a presidential run and instead become a Cabinet officer in a second Eisenhower administration. Nixon believed such an action would destroy his political career. When Eisenhower announced his reelection bid in February , he hedged on the choice of his running mate, stating that it was improper to address that question until he had been renominated. Although no Republican was opposing Eisenhower, Nixon received a substantial number of write-in votes against the President in the New Hampshire primary election. In late April, the President announced that Nixon would again be his running mate. In early , Nixon undertook another major foreign trip, this time to Africa. On his return, he helped shepherd the Civil Rights Act of through Congress. The bill was weakened in the Senate, and civil rights leaders were divided over whether Eisenhower should sign it. Nixon advised the President to sign the bill, which he did. In Montevideo , Uruguay, Nixon made an impromptu visit to a college campus, where he fielded questions from students on U. The trip was uneventful until the Nixon party reached Lima , Peru, where he was met with student demonstrations. Nixon went to the campus, got out of his car to confront the students, and stayed until forced back into the car by a volley of thrown objects. At his hotel, Nixon faced another mob, and one demonstrator spat on him. On July 24, while touring the exhibits with Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev , the two stopped at a model of an American kitchen and engaged in an impromptu exchange about the merits of capitalism versus communism that became known as the " Kitchen Debate ".

Nations are merely extensions of the fundamental, evolved human impulse toward tribalism based on kinship. We believe in Love of our Own, not Hatred for Others - "Racism" is traditionally defined as irrational hatred for another race. Our ideology is not focused on hatred for others, but on a desire to preserve and protect European peoples. We believe in embracing National and Ethnic Identity, symbolism, and ideals An ethnically, culturally, and linguistically homogeneous nation will tend to yield the best outcomes. Any blatant hate speech, and any calls for violence, even in jest, will result in a ban. Also, no baiting others to break these rules. No unwarranted ad hominem or racial slurs. We are here for serious political and philosophical discussion. For example, calling someone a racist or expressing disbelief that someone would hold a certain view or ideology is intellectually lazy. Rather, explain why you believe their ideological position is immoral or unsound.

Any one of these comments would have disqualified Nugent from stepping foot into any other White House. Trump, however, spent four hours squiring Nugent and his other guests around the executive mansion. Not only has Trump himself recently won coveted trademarks from China, but so has his daughter Ivanka , who is a senior aide to her father in arguable violation of an anti-nepotism law.
