Geranium The hardy geranium is exactly the type of plant Verey liked to use: Try Geranium magnificum for large, reliable and vigorous clumps which bear violet flowers in late spring. Cut it back to ground level after flowering before it goes mildewy. Aquilegia blooms early in spring Campanula The peach-leafed bellflower, Campanula persicifolia, has tall spikes of charming, garden-cottage style white or violet flowers. Campanula is ideal for sunny borders, where it will seed about and weave airily among other plants. Its great among roses or clumps of herbaceous peonies. Allium Verey used these statement bulbs frequentlyâ€” notably to create a river of contrasting deep purple along a golden-yellow laburnum walk. To get the look, plant masses of the bulbs in autumn amid herbaceous plant borders. Measure out a geometric layout, put down pretty paths with a mix of bricks and pavers and edge each bed with low box. Choose a traditional design in stone or cast stone to get the look. Clipped Forms Verey was a big fan of topiary, filling gardens with cones and balls of box and columns of yew. Try topiary to keep informal borders neatly contained. Box works well, as would Ilex crenata, ivy, or a soft hedge of grey-leaved Ballota pseudodictamnus. Richard Gatensby suggests other Verey favourites, such as Viola cornuta and simple forget-me-nots.
