Bethlehem Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem Lori Erickson photo Surrounded by rocky hills, Bethlehem is one of the most sacred places in Christianity, honored as the birthplace of both King David and Jesus. The city is just five miles south of Jerusalem, but since it has been part of the Palestinian National Authority rather than Israel. While many Palestinians have difficulties traveling across the border into Israel, tourists are free to come and go with only a brief stop at a checkpoint. The primary holy site in Bethlehem is the Church of the Nativity. The Emperor Constantine and his mother Helena had a church constructed here around A. Visitors enter through a small opening called the Door of Humility designed for easy defense in case of attack. As in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, there is often a long wait to enter this sacred spot. Some of you might perhaps have seen a YouTube video that went viral, which showed monks fighting each other with brooms in this very church. On our tour I asked our guide if this scuffle really happened. Adjacent to the Church of the Nativity is the Church of St. Catherine, the place from which the annual midnight Christmas mass is broadcast around the world. In its courtyard stands a statue of St. Jerome, who lived here in the fifth century and who first translated the Bible into Latin, and underneath are crypts that are said to be the burial places of St. Jerome and other early saints. Just a few blocks from the Church of the Nativity is the Milk Grotto, a small white church that is built over a cave where the Holy Family is said to have taken shelter on their flight to Egypt. Some of her milk is believed to have spilled on the stone of the cave, turning its walls white. Nearby is a place called Shepherds Fields, which commemorates the angels appearing to announce the birth of Jesus to the shepherds tending their flocks. While she has a pass that allows her to travel back-and-forth relatively easily between Bethlehem and Jerusalem, the great majority of Palestinians do not have that freedom including her own daughters. This has led to great economic and personal hardships for many. Olive wood carving is a particularly time-honored craft in this city. For many centuries the small figurines created by the carvers of Bethlehem have been used as teaching tools for the Biblical story. The association ensures that the artisans receive a fair price for their labors but their handwork is still sold at reasonable prices. I left Bethlehem in a somber mood, grateful to have seen this ancient holy place but troubled by unease. I thought of those fighting monks in the Church of the Nativity and of the intractable tensions between Israelis and Palestinians. Perhaps there is some small consolation in the fact that this part of the world has long been a place of conflict, situated as it is on a strategic land bridge between continents and home to a mix of religions and cultures. What is going on now is another chapter in a long saga.

With good training and practice, everyone involved will be better able to react appropriately in the event of an actual emergency. Drills allow administrators, staff and students to mitigate, prepare for and recover from a variety of incidents. We want our families to have a better understanding of the different drills we practice throughout the year so you can help your student feel prepared and safe. Evacuation Drill What most people remember as fire drills are now known as evacuation drills. Students remain quiet, there is no cell phone use and attendance is taken at the evacuation location. Students return to class once building leaders give the OK. State law requires lockdown drills to be practiced 4 times a year. All movement within the school is restricted. All students, staff and visitors must report immediately to the nearest classroom, gym or cafeteria. Rooms remain locked until unlocked by police. Lockout Drill A lockout secures the outer perimeter of the building. Students who are outdoors are brought inside. All exterior doors are locked and windows are closed and locked. In a lockout, there is no classroom disruption. Bus Evacuation Drill Three times a year, all students whether or not they regularly ride a bus practice how to exit the bus safely in the event of an emergency. Shelter-in-Place Drill In some instances, it is safer to remain inside the building, such as during a tornado or other severe weather. Students will be instructed to move to a safe location within the school. Classroom doors are closed but remain unlocked. Students in hallways go to nearest classroom. All students and staff remain in place until further notice.

Tuesday, 9 April, , Bethlehem battle-scarred The fighting has left Bethlehem a battered city By Caroline Hawley BBC correspondent in Bethlehem From the top floor of the Star Hotel, the scene is spectacular - Bethlehem nestles in sun-dappled hills, its church spires set against a clear spring sky. From the distance, the biblical city looks like a place at peace. Local residents say Israelis bring destruction everywhere But sporadic gunfire crackles through deserted streets, along with the occasional burst of tank fire and loudspeaker calls by Israeli soldiers, demanding that the Palestinians holed up inside the Church of the Nativity surrender. About Palestinians, many of them armed, are still refusing to leave the Church of the Nativity, where a Palestinian policeman died in a gun-fight early on Monday. His body remains in the church. The Israeli army says its soldiers have taken up several positions in Manger Square, but it is still refusing to pull back or to allow journalists to reach the area. Warning shots are fired at those who try. Battle-scarred Church leaders have called on Israel to "go in peace. The past week has left Bethlehem a battered, battle-scarred city, its people apprehensive about how the stand-off at the Church of the Nativity will end. I expect Israeli commandos will go in Local hotel manager The streets leading to Manger Square are littered with broken glass and spent bullet shells. Water spews from broken pipes. Onslaught fears Even though the Israeli army has repeatedly promised not to storm the Church of the Nativity, many believe it might. Now, its only inhabitants are journalists, and the restaurant window bears the bullet-holes of shots fired at a cameraman trying to film from it last week. A convoy of reporters trying to take a sick colleague to hospital had to turn back when the road in front of them was raked by machine gun fire on Tuesday afternoon. The BBC team in Bethlehem put on flak jackets and helmets inside our make-shift office after shots were fired just outside the hotel. Hunt for food The round-the-clock curfew was lifted briefly on Monday, but is now firmly back in place. Most residents are cowering in their homes, running short of supplies. The Red Cross says a food truck it managed to bring into Bethlehem on Monday was "besieged" by people. As we tried to reach Manger Square earlier, we met a small group of women defying the curfew on a desperate but ultimately fruitless hunt for medicines, baby milk and nappies. Hassan says nothing can stop him from playing outside his house "We were afraid at the beginning," said year old mother of 10, Ibtisam Zabalani. They beat the kids, even though they did nothing. And she showed me scratch marks on her arms that she accused the soldiers of causing. The only other person we encountered on the street - aside from fellow journalists - was nine-year-old Hassan Ishaq, who was taking advantage of a lull in the shooting to play football with his sister, just outside the Star Hotel.
