As computer networks collapse, factories and chemical plants explode, satellites spin out of control and the financial and power grids fail. That seems alarmist to many experts. Yet most agree that infiltrating networks is pretty easy for those who have the will, means and the time to spare. Governments know this because they are such enthusiastic hackers themselves. Spies frequently break into computer systems to steal information by the warehouse load, whether it is from Google or defence contractors. Penetrating networks to damage them is not much harder. And, if you take enough care, nobody can prove you did it. The cyber-attacks on Estonia in and on Georgia in the latter strangely happened to coincide with the advance of Russian troops across the Caucasus are widely assumed to have been directed by the Kremlin, but they could be traced only to Russian cyber-criminals. Many of the computers used in the attack belonged to innocent Americans whose pes had been hijacked. Companies suspect China of organising mini-raids to ransack Western know-how: One reason why Western governments have until recently been reticent about cyber-espionage is surely because they are dab hands at it, too. As with nuclear bombs, the existence of cyber-weapons does not in itself mean they are about to be used. Moreover, an attacker cannot be sure what effect an assault will have on another country, making their deployment highly risky. That is a drawback for sophisticated military machines, but not necessarily for terrorists or the armies of rogue states. And it leaves the dangers of online crime and espionage. All this makes for dangerous

instability. Nobody knows their true power, so countries must prepare for the worst. Even as computerised weapons systems and wired infantry have blown away some of the fog of war from the battlefield, they have covered cyberspace in a thick, menacing blanket of uncertainty. One response to this growing threat has been military. Russia, Israel and North Korea boast efforts of their own. America has set up its new Cyber Command both to defend its networks and devise attacks on its enemies. NATO is debating the extent to which it should count cyberwar as a form of "armed attack" that would oblige its members to come to the aid of an ally. But the world needs cyberarms-control as well as cyberdeterrence. America has until recently resisted weapons treaties for cyberspace for fear that they could lead to rigid global regulation of the internet, undermining the dominance of American internet companies, stifling innovation and restricting the openness that underpins the net. Perhaps America also fears that its own cyberwar effort has the most to lose if its well-regarded cyberspies and cyber-warriors are reined in. Such thinking at last shows signs of changing, and a good thing too. America, as the country most reliant on computers, is probably most vulnerable to cyber-attack. Its conventional military power means that foes will look for asymmetric lines of attack. And the wholesale loss of secrets through espionage risks eroding its economic and military lead. Nuclear warheads can be counted and missiles tracked. Cyber-weapons are more like biological agents; they can be made just about anywhere. So in the meantime countries should agree on more modest accords, or even just informal "rules of the road" that would raise the political cost of cyber-attacks. Countries should be encouraged to spell out their military policies in cyberspace, as America does for nuclear weapons, missile defence and space. And there could be an international centre to monitor cyber-attacks, or an international "duty to assist" countries under cyber-attack, regardless of the nationality or motive of the attacker-akin to the duty of ships to help mariners in distress. The internet is not a "commons", but a network of networks that are mostly privately owned. A lot could also be achieved by greater co-operation between governments and the private sector. They could take more responsibility for identifying infected computers and spotting attacks as they happen. None of this will eradicate crime, espionage or wars in cyberspace. But it could make the world a little bit safer. The 2,page Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, now nearing the end of its odyssey through Congress, tackles almost every aspect of American finance from municipal bonds to executive pay. Its success, however, rests on a simple question: The reform does make progress in three critical areas: Much depends on how American regulators implement its provisions. Congress left several meaty matters for later, including the crippled mortgage giants, Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac. And even more is riding on how the Basel club of international banking supervisors compel banks to raise their buffers of capital and liquidity. Start with what the bill gets right. Dodd-Frank missed its chance to eliminate that patchwork, but offers decent alternatives. It creates a council to advise regulators on emerging threats. It consolidates oversight of consumer financial products, from mortgages to credit cards, in a single agency. Though a secondary player in the crisis, derivatives are a perennial candidate for causing the next one because they add opacity and leverage to the financial system. Most derivatives that now trade dealer-to-dealer will be traded on public exchanges. An extreme proposal to stop banks trading derivatives has been mercifully scaled back. The most important provision is the resolution authority under which federal regulators can seize any financial company whose failure threatens the financial system, and quickly payoff secured creditors while imposing losses on shareholders and unsecured creditors. This is an improvement on the status quo. Such resolution authority already exists for banks, but for other companies like Lehman Brothers and American International Group, regulators face a dreadful choice of either bailing out the company and its creditors or letting it go bankrupt. Yet in its zeal to protect taxpayers, Congress has made the resolution process so similar to bankruptcy that counterparties and lenders may still choose to abandon a troubled firm to avoid losses. Other steps are still needed: But the horrible truth is that the effectiveness of any such body will be discovered only when a real crisis occurs. Meanwhile there are two other ways to mitigate the risks flowing from banks that are seen as too big to fail. One is to claw back the subsidy such firms enjoy in their borrowing, both to encourage them to shrink and to pay for the clean-up when they fail. Barack Obama has proposed a bank tax

that would serve the purpose. Despite the failure of the G20 to agree on such a tax last week, America and other countries should press ahead. The other is to force financial institutions to have more capital and liquidity to make collapses less likely in the first place. Negotiations in Basel have slowed as Europeans fret that stiffening standards may slow lending and hinder economic recovery. Implementation should indeed not be rushed. Yet in the longer term bigger buffers are essential. The risks cut two ways. Banks and their lobbyists may persuade regulators to interpret the new rules in the friendliest possible way to Wall Street, as they did before the crunch: In the opposite direction, regulators may overreach-stifling innovation which, for all its recent excesses, has over time been a force for good. At the G20 Mr Obama boasted of "leading by example" on financial reform. In fact, Dodd-Frank is too idiosyncratically American and too incomplete to be a true template for others. And his claim that it would keep a financial crisis like the one the world just went through "from ever happening again" is bound to prove wrong. It should be taken for what it is: Its critics point out that China has never ruled out the use of force to bring about unification, nor stopped adding to its battery of coastal missiles menacing the island. But there are still at least three good reasons why Taiwan and the West should welcome the deal. A tiny minority favours imminent unification.

Mahmud yesterday said the strictness would keep the youngsters away from any wrongdoing. The rescue operation was closed after the launch was hauled up and brought to the riverbank. Residents of the area claimed there were closer to people aboard the stricken vessel. A total of 69 bodies have been recovered so far while some passengers are still reportedly missing. The BIWTA study said that despite the repeated occurrence of maritime mishaps in the country, the government had yet to implement probe committee suggestions aimed at decreasing the incidence of accidents. And even these recommendations have not been implemented. The youths, aged between 18 and 22 years, however, did not have any major injury marks of beating but their bodies were riddled with bullet injuries in the chest, abdomen, waist, hands, arms, back and legs, morgue sources said. In another incident, the bullet-hit bodies of two BNP men were found in Jhenidah Sadar yesterday morning. They beat and shot them leaving critically injured. The inquest reports of the three victims, prepared before the autopsy, had the same narrative. According to the report of one year-old victim, whom the police assumed to be a non-Muslim, he had 16 marks of bullet injuries. He was wearing a yellow T-shirt and pants. Another youth, aged around 20 years, had 16 marks of bullet injuries. In a Facebook post yesterday, Manna acknowledged that he did have a phone conversation about the ongoing political movement with BNP Vice-Chairman Sadeque Hossain Khoka, but said there was no conspiracy or bad intention in that conversation. Hasan Mahmud made the call while speaking at a human chain, organised by Bangladesh Swadhinata Parishad, in front of National Press Club yesterday. Four of the casualties were male children, 10 were female children, 22 were adult males and 21 were adult females, she said. The administration could not say for sure how many passengers had managed to swim ashore or to nearby vessels. Witness reports suggest perhaps 35 or 40 people survived the accident. Many relatives of passengers say their loved ones are still missing. The depth of the river where the launch sank was about 20ft and there was no strong current. He told the Dhaka Tribune: For example, the Pinak 6 rescue operation failed due to bad weather and strong currents. The captain of Nargis 1, the vessel which crashed into the MV Mostafa causing it to capsize and sink, and three of his assistants were arrested in connection with the accident. The Department of Shipping has formed a three-member probe committee to determine the cause of the accident and identify those who were responsible. A separate Shipping Ministry probe committee, consisting of 11 members, has also been convened to look into the matter. Meanwhile, sources said Al Amin broke down in tears, apologised and begged for mercy from the Bangladesh team management after admitting his mistake. But the sources said the management had to make the decision following quite a few incidents that indicated his suspicious activities in Australia. A source revealed an incident that had taken place on February 19 and said after the team dinner Al Amin left the hotel by a car and returned around midnight on foot. Bangladesh are scheduled for a training session today at the Melbourne Cricket Ground. They said corruption in the process of certifying water craft must be stopped. Despite Shipping Ministry rules for A, B and C category launches, lower standard B and C category launch owners rarely followed the rules and regulations. MV Mostafa probe committee The convener of the member Ship-ping Ministry probe committee, Joint Secretary Nur-ur Rahman, visited the accident site near Paturia Ghat in Mani-kganj yesterday and spoke with several witnesses. Nur-ur Rahman yesterday told the Dhaka Tribune: We will also talk to the survivors of the accident, the launch operators and to nearby villagers. We are trying to determine the causes of the accident as quickly as possible. The body of the other victim, aged around 20 years, had a total of 22 bullet injuries. Several marks of bullet were found on a wall where the incident took place yesterday. There were marks of blood on the road and a wall. There was also a long blood-stained rope on the spot. However, when a team of police went to the spot in the noon, they drove away the onlookers. Collecting the bullet shells and the rope, they threw those in a drain. Some dwellers claimed that they had seen around 10 armed people entering the lane and stayed there for around an hour. About taking much time to send the bodies to the hospital, he said the locals had informed the police after an hour of the incident. Jhut trader Wadud was going to his business shop at Tolarbagh from Mirpur house. Salahuddin Khan, OC of Mirpur police, claimed that during primary interrogation, Wadud had admitted his involvement in several arson attacks during the blockade. Wadud was declared dead around 1: According the inquest report, the victim had marks of six bullet injuries on his body. He later told reporters that Wadud had been in jhut business for 10 years and that he had two shops in Tolar-bag. The OC then denied having arrested him. He was not named as accused in any case. He used to stay with his parents and two siblings at home. Moreover, the family members of such criminals usually do not admit these matters. Alal Hossain, elder brother of Dulal, told the Dhaka Tribune that his brother had been picked up by the DB police on Wednesday evening from Chuadanga bus stand of Jhenidah town. On the other hand, relatives of Posh claimed that he had been caught by DB police around 5pm on Thursday from Saradganj bazaar in Chuadanga. The bodies bore marks of bullet injuries on their ears and wounds on the hands. He alleged that the law enforcers had killed them so that no BNP activist dared to bring out any procession in the town. A team of Sadar police led by SI Anwar Hossain recovered the bodies from the spot and sent those to Jhenidah sadar hospital for post mortem examination. Sourav has been working as the chef of MV Mostafa for nearly a decade, said Ayesha. Another survivor Moushumi, who managed to swim ashore after the accident, said: MV Mostafa had a capacity of passengers but is believed to have been overloaded when it left Paturia. The exact number of passengers boarding the launch has not yet been determined. Factory inspection directorate awaits massive overhaul Election as per constitution: PM n Tribune Desk Vacant posts to be filled by yearend to improve safety monitoring as government expects review of US GSP decision n Asif Showkat Kallol The government will overhaul the factory inspection directorate and increase its human resources to 2, from only now to ensure factory safetyâ€™a must for getting US generalised system of preferences GSP for Bangladesh, official sources said. The secretary of the ministry Mikail Shipar said the enhanced capacity of the inspection directorate will help minimise industrial disasters like the collapse of Rana Plaza in future. At present, there are 84 safety inspectors against the permanent posts of for 29, registered factories and over , unregistered factories across the country, according to the Department of the Chief Inspector of Factories and Establishments. The US scrapped the trade privilege on June 27, citing serious shortcomings in labour rights and working condition after Tazreen Fashions fire and Rana Plaza building collapse. Of the major progresses, the labour and employment ministry has taken preparations to publish an advertisement in newspapers to appoint factory inspectors within the next 10 days, labour ministry sources said. As per the requirement in the action plan agreed by the government, it might not be possible to appoint all the inspectors by December, but many of the formalities could be completed by the yearend, the labour secretary said. He said the ministry might be able to make related rules and regulations by December to apply the amended labour law that allowed full-freedom of trade unionism by workers at the factory level. Shafi n Tribune Report Shah Ahmad Shafi, ameer of Islamist group Hefazat-e-Islam Bangladesh, has said Hefazat has been a non-political organisation since the beginning and it will not be associated with any political party or alliance. In response, Ashraf made a phone call to Fakhrul acknowledging that he received the letter. BNP later said they would not join the elections if Hasina remained as the head of the interim government. The dialogue issue took the centre stage again on Friday while Fakhrul told media that he tried several times to reach Ashraf over phone to talk about holding dialogue but failed to reach him. Hours after, Ashraf ruled out his claim. He should talk to his leader first. Responding to Ashraf, Fakhrul yesterday said: Do not waste time anymore. Though earlier BNP said dialogue should be focused only on its demand for a non-partisan interim administration. Khaleda, also the former premier, on Thursday reiterated that her party would not compromise on non-partisan government: In the wake of recent bloody shutdowns Hasina, on November 9, at a programme said: Problems could be solved only if the prime minister resigned, he said. On October 18, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on a televised address to the nation proposed the formation of an all-party government to hold polls and appealed to the opposition to give names of their lawmakers for the interim cabinet. The premier said the BNP chief did never want to see Bangladesh as an independent country as she always patronised the killers of and the war criminals. She Khaleda wanted to bring back those elements again, Hasina added. Deploring the recent acts of the opposition party to kill people through arson attacks, Hasina urged all to hunt down those culprits and hand them over to the law enforcing agencies. The Prime Minister also requested the media not to sit idle when pro-hartal activists go on arson attacks. And our position is: I have not attended office since. He added that his party was out of the Awami League-led grand alliance. Quader said party chief Ershad had been working on choosing a new alliance to take part in the polls. He also said the new alliance would be an election alliance rather than anything else. Regarding the public statement posted on the Indian High Commission website on Bangladesh situation, he said: So it was only intended as a matter of clarification. Quader said their party chief would hold meetings with other parties and announce a new alliance for competing in the elections. Dialogue n Muktasree Chakma Sathi Lawyers, former diplomats and rights activists at a dialogue yesterday stressed that media should use national and international mechanisms in reporting human rights issues and for protection from any kind of harassment by the state. They also pointed out that pressuring the government by international mechanism and pressure groups, such as diplomats and international media, could help improve the human rights situation in the country. Ambassador Harun ur Rashid said the media played an important role in creating awareness as well as acting as a pressure group to uphold human rights. Dhaka Tribune Editor Zafar Sobhan said the government had a tendency to act unresponsively on human rights violation until the issue was being picked up by international media or watchdogs. Lawyer Jyotirmoy said most of the time media is vocal in protecting human rights. I even doubt how far their understanding goes when it is about human rights. Echoing Syeed, Tahmina of Article 19 said if such groups always enjoy exemption from the laws in the country, culture of impunity is hard to eliminate. According to parliamentary practices, the president would prorogue the last session, but not dissolve the House, chief whip Abdus Shahid told the Dhaka Tribune yesterday. On November 20, Leader of the House and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will deliver her closing speech, which she had earlier decided to give on October Speaker Shirin Sharmin Chaudhury on November 10 adjourned the ongoing session of parliament until November According to the constitution, the next parliamentary polls must take place within 90 days before the completion of the five-year tenure of parliament. The first sitting was held on January 25, setting January 24, as the date for completion of tenure of the House. The government shifted from its stance on ending the current parliament. The BNP and its allies say the government must restore the provision for a non-party caretaker government that arranged the last three general elections starting in The Awami League on June 30, annulled the constitutional provision of the non-party caretaker government that used to take office after the completion of a five-year parliament. The unelected administration, which both the parties blame for rigging in the last three polls, would hold the elections in 90 days, without taking any policy decision. But the last caretaker government stayed in office for about two years January 11, to January 6, Both BNP and Awami League alleged that the last caretaker government was out to purge the politicians in the name of launching anti-corruption drives. Sheikh Hasina said she would form an all-party interim government with the elected representatives to assist the Election Commission to hold the next polls. They also called on the government to slap ban on Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami and its other organisations, under the Anti-terrorism Act The observations came in a written statement issued by a recently formed civil platform, Bangladesh Rukhe Darao which was signed by 24 eminent citizens of the country. Repeated strikes called by the opposition were not only creating havoc in public life, but also pushing the country towards an economic crisis. The commission on Thursday sent a letter to the president seeking appointment for a meeting to inform him about the overall preparations and getting suggestion about a suitable date of announcing the schedules, said an EC official. The chief election commissioner and the four election commissioners might meet President Abdul Hamid this week, the official also said. Meanwhile, the commission yesterday sent another letter to the BG Press asking it to print nomination forms for the polls. In a closed door meeting held on Thursday, the full commission discussed the possible options of announcing the polls. The commission reportedly thought that the last week of November would be appropriate for announcing schedules. By then it will be clear what will happen and what we will do during this time. The election commissioner added that the countdown to election had already started on October EC officials said the commission would send around 40, nomination forms to its field-level offices this week after the printing was done. He said the printing of voter lists and distribution of around seven million national identity NID cards were at its last stages.

Friday, September 20, 2 killed, 70 injured on day two of Jamaat hartal Constable shot by pro-hartal activists still in critical condition The party claims that around activists were injured in police actions and arrested in two days Dhaka Medical College Hospital. Iqbal was initially admitted to the Satkania upazila health complex, but was moved to the Chittagong Medical College Hospital, where he went under surgery. The doctors at NIDCH performed a four-hour long surgery on the constable, but said Iqbal was still in a critical condition. He said expert physicians were taking care of Iqbal at the ICU, as he was still not out of danger. One of the two deceased was a Jamaat activist, who was killed in Meherpur in a clash with police. The other was a passenger of an auto-rickshaw who was allegedly killed by pickets in Sirajganj. Incidents of clashes, arson attacks, vandalism and explosions also took place in the capital and elsewhere in the country. Law enforcers arrested many leaders and activists of Jamaat and its students front Islami Chhatra Shibir from different parts of the country. On Wednesday the first day of the shutdown pickets allegedly killed the driver of an auto-rickshaw in Noakhali. Jamaat called the hartal on Tuesday soon after the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court sentenced the Jamaat assistant secretary general to death, overruling the International Crimes Tribunal judgement that had given him life term for crimes committed against humanity during the Liberation War. Jamaat acting secretary general Rafiqul Islam Khan yesterday claimed that around party activists were injured in police actions and were arrested by police during the hour hartal. Apart from the death of Jamaat activist Delwar Hossain, 40, about 50 others, including policemen, were injured in clashes between law enforcers and pickets in Mujibnagar upazila. But the full, final list was not available yet, she added. Meanwhile, Dipu said she was not aware of a planned meeting between the Bangladesh prime minister and her Indian counterpart, Manmohan Singh, on the sideline of the UNGA. The foreign ministry confirmed through an SMS around 8: About a joint statement issued by the border forces of both countries on Wednesday, Dipu said she could not comment on it as she had not read the full text. One foreign ministry official expressed surprise on how Bangladesh accepted such a joint statement as, he said, Border Guard Bangladesh does not kill any Indian nationals. However, the foreign minister, said: Another victim, truck driver Sekendar Bepari, 42, was on his way to Chittagong from Dhaka on Wednesday night to deliver three power generators. After he stopped for a rest at Chouddogram in Comilla, around 40 pro-hartal activists attacked his truck and set it on fire. While talking to this correspondent, his wife, Ruma Begum, fell to the floor and started sobbing. The couple has two school-going children, aged six and Another truck driver, Shamsur Rahman Samsu, 55, was going to Panchagarh from Shirajganj with a truck load- ed with fertiliser. When he stopped for a break near the Bogra-Shahjahanpur road on Wednesday night, a group of hartal activists attacked the truck and set it ablaze. His helper, Shahin, managed to get away from the burning truck. But Samsu, who tried to douse the flames, was overcomes by the flames. His two wives, Golap Banu and Sabina Begum, were waiting outside the ICU door, worried about how they and their seven children would manage to survive if anything happened to Samsu. Iqbal Ahmed, a doctor at the burn unit, said they were trying their best to treat the injured patients, who are all in critical conditions. Also on Wednesday, Abu Naser, 45, an auto-rickshaw driver, died after he was attacked with sticks and brickbats by pro-hartal activists in the Talerchara area of Companiganj in Noakhali. In another drive, Jatrabari police arrested 10 Shibir men at around 9: A bus driver along with 10 passengers were injured when Jamaat-Shibir men torched the bus on the Dhaka-Mymensingh highway at Vogra bypass area in Joydevpur Upazila. Witnesses said a group of pickets disguised as passengers boarded on the bus and torched it around 8: Injured driver Nazrul Islam, 45, was first admitted to a local clinic with severe burn injuries and later shifted to the during the clash, was shifted to the Combined Medical Hospital

CMH in Jessore. His condition was stated to be critical as he remained unconscious. Two cases were filed against leaders and activists of Jamaat-Shibir. He sustained injuries after pickets attacked him at Sirajganj Sadar upazila. Witnesses said the auto-rickshaw skidded off the road after being chased by the pickets, who then swooped on the vehicle and mercilessly beat up Masud and Alam, the other passenger. Pickets clashed with police in Azimpur around 7: During the clashes that followed, Jamaat-Shibir men hurled several crude bombs while police fired several rounds of teargas canisters. In the older part of Dhaka, Shibir men exploded at least seven crude bombs near the Jagannath University around 2: If he does not seek mercy within the stipulated time, then the death sentence will be executed not before 21 days and not after 28 days. Acting on short verdict of the Supreme Court, the government earlier annulled the caretaker government system, while the Election Commission barred Jamaate-Islami from contesting in Barguna 2 by-polls. Farid Uddin Khan, a key defence counsel for Quader Molla, claimed that execution was not possible on a short verdict. He told the Dhaka Tribune: The judge will send it to the five-member bench headed by Chief Justice Md Muzammel Hossain as the Chamber Judge has no authority to stay execution of the verdict. Moreover, the decision on seeking presidential clemency depends on him and his family, the lawyer said. There may be prescription from Jamaat. Hasina changed her mind of not attending the UNGA a day after it was reported in the media. Ambassador-at-large Ziauddin was preparing the draft, the official said. Shamsher Mobin quoted Khaleda as saying in the letter: A meaningful dialogue is the only way to solve the prevailing political crisis. Kerry had sent letters to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and the Leader of the Opposition Khaleda Zia on September 8, urging the two top leaders to find a way to hold free, fair and credible elections. Kerry wrote to the two top leaders just 15 days after the UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon had requested them over phone to reach an amicable solution. Earlier in May, Ban had sent Oscar Fernandez-Taranco, UN assistant secretary-general for political affairs, apparently to create grounds for a political dialogue. Taranco met the prime minister, opposition leader, speaker, chief election commissioner, leaders of political parties and selected members of civil society. After the meetings, he expressed concern that time was running out to find a solution to holding free, fair, credible and non-violent elections. He taken to the DMCH with severe burn injuries. During the clash, Chhatra League men hacked Mehedi Hasan, a fourth year student of chemistry of Rajshahi University, on suspicion that he was a Shibir activist. Mehedi was admitted to the Rajshahi Medical College Hospital in critical condition. The amendment was published in a gazette notification the next day. B1 Business Bangladesh Bank yesterday unveiled monetary policy statement, keeping private sector credit growth and other key policy rates unchanged from the immediate past policy. Will you able to discuss something with those who killed your parents and family members? Hasina, also chief of Awami League, blamed BNP founder Ziaur Rahman for killing her family members and others on August 15, , and said dialogue could not be held with the killers. It is not easy for me to forget these and forgive the killers. The nation witnessed how she misbehaved with me, refusing my invitation to dinner. I will not hold any dialogue with her anymore. Why will the people pay for their mistake? They will have to assume responsibility for their mistakes. Now the people are in comfortable and peaceful moods. So why do you want to create a situation of unrest? Referring to her phone call to Khaleda before the January 5 election, she said: Sources said among illegal drugs, Phensidyl is at the top of the list while Yaba is in the 2nd position. Phensidyl and hemp are smuggled into the country from India while Yaba and heroin from Myanmar. Not just the vehicle drivers, even the pedestrians are not immune to this extortion. Victims say police extort public transport drivers more or less throughout the year, but the month of Ramadan puts them into an overdrive. The Dhaka Tribune has learned that a section of law enforcers have been extorting vehicle drivers at more than 50 points in the capital alone. Estimates show that around 3, trucks, 5, covered vans enter and exit Dhaka through at least seven points. Additionally, around 1, CNG autorickshaws and 15, buses operate within the boundaries of the city. On that count, police extort more than Tk5 crore every day. Trucker Mohammad Bijoy told the Dhaka Tribune: Later, upon getting information them, two other BNP activists were picked up from their residences on the same day, she said. Following the death of accused Rashad Miah on January 1 at his house, the court directed the Savar police to submit a report before it mentioning reason behind his death. Sources say the accused died of a heart attack. After that the court deferred the trial proceedings in four scheduled dates. Additional public prosecutor Ananda Chandra yesterday told the Dhaka Tribune: Mostafa Kamal, OC of Savar police station, said he was not informed about the court directives as he joined the station recently. A gang killed the six youths and left another critically injured in the early hours on July 18, near Aminbazar Bridge. Later they took the bodies more than half a kilometre away to Keblarchar on the advice of police and called the villagers saying that robbers had been caught. The mob started bludgeoning the six, without knowing that the youths had already died. Subsequently, it was labelled as an incident of mob beating. Their friend Al Amin is the lone survivor of the incident. Fourteen accused gave confessional statements before magistrates. Of the accused, 46 are now on bail, four in jail custody while nine are fugitive. Shomsher Mobin Chowdhury, vice chairman of the party, said: Now we look at the future. The former foreign secretary said diplomatic ties would be hampered through such statement. The victim Monir Hossain, 30, is a resident of Khilgaon. He was intercepted by a gang of muggers near Motijhil Ideal School and College. The muggers stabbed Monir and snatched away Tk58, from his possession while he was on his way home. In a separate incident, a gang of muggers snatched Tk2 lakh from a daily sales representative of Compu Gas International BD Ltd, an agent of Robi Axiata Ltd, after stabbing him yesterday at Mohanagar project area in the city. The victim Abdul Hannan Sohel, 30, is a resident of Mogbazar. His colleague got him admitted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital. They said there were from RAB and were taking the two only for interrogation. They were never involved in any crime. Members of the other families alleged that the Bhatara police station did not accept even a general diary. The RAB members took my son telling us they needed to interrogate him. So, the prime minister must know about the forced disappearances carried out by the law enforcement agencies. She has to take the responsibilities for these incidents. But this never happens because the higher levels do not want it. We have to raise our voice against these crimes. This is also extreme

violation of human rights. I request them to not take anyone from RAB. There might be evil intentions behind this. The allegation you [the reporter] are talking about is still out of my knowledge. After getting information from this organisation and collecting data from 49 police stations of the capital, Department of Narcotics Control had already made a list of drug dealers who were controlling the drug market in the city. Pronab Kumar Niyogi, director operations of the DNC, told the Dhaka Tribune that they had launched special drive to stop drug sale and its use before Eid. They met the director general of Border Security Force during his recent visit at Banglabandh border point, he said, adding that at that time, they also sought cooperation to stop smuggling of drugs into the country. But according to Family Health International, it has crossed 50 lakh. At present, there are 32 types of drugs available in the country. The investigation agency said due to absence of proper investigation and witnesses, it is not possible for them to submit charge sheets in most of the drug cases. According to sources in law enforcement agency, at least 30, drug cases are now pending across the country. In most cases, local drug dealers are caught, but masterminds are at large. Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal, state minister for home, told the Dhaka Tribune that it is not possible to control drug smuggling only by enforcing laws. Do you want to humiliate me for a second time? When asked whether the next election would be held under the prime minister, Hasina said it would be held in a democratic way as per the constitution. We will meet them on the streets as a political party, Awami League, where the countrymen will also be [with us] there. Regarding threats by BNP leaders including Standing Committee member ASM Hannan Shah that Hasina would be responsible if any incident occurred similar to that on August 15, the premier said it was a direct threat to kill her. In reply, the premier said: But it does not mean that Cameron expressed disappointment. A CNG autorickshaw driver Abdul said: He charges at least Tk His main targets were motorbikes. According to biker Zakir, even if a biker produced valid documents, the ASI would not let them go unless they paid him an amount. Buses that ply the longer intercity routes are generally not allowed to enter the capital before 10pm. If anyone tries to enter earlier than that, they become easy targets of police extortion. But that does not mean those who follow the 10pm-rule are spared. By the time they enter the city, many have already paid Tk2, Tk3, extortion including the amounts that are squeezed out by Dhaka police. Mahmudul Alam Montu, secretary of an association of bus and covered van owners, said: Their job is to provide security, but instead they take money. We cannot take any action against police. Sometimes, I come home late. I have faced harassment in the name of security checking by police many times. They only freed me when I gave them money. The situation gets worse before Eid. When asked whether they were aware of the situation, the police high ups never give any direct answer. Last year, we introduced a special team in plainclothes to resist extortion. She was killed by a stalker after her family refused a marriage proposal from him. In DSCC, there are 1,, voters who will cast their ballots at polling stations; in DNCC, there are 2,, voters who will vote at polling stations; in Chittagong, there are 1,, voters who will exercise their voting rights at polling centres. Thirty BGB platoons have already been deployed across Chittagong, while the police, Ansar and RAB forces would be deployed at the poll centres from today. Each general poll centre and vulnerable poll centres would get 22 and 24 law enforcers respectively, including armed personnel. Around 17, police and Ansar men would be deployed for security inside the polling centres in Chittagong, while the police, RAB and BGB would be deployed as striking forces outside the centres. Besides, executive magistrates and 10 judicial magistrates have been assigned for maintaining law and order situation during the polls across Chittagong city. Also, our polling agents have been constantly threatened. No one can campaign fearlessly when the situa- tion is so. The young aspirant passed a hectic day campaigning from morning to evening as yes- terday marked the last day of campaigns for city corporation polls. He started the campaign at Bashtala in Shahajadpur around 8: During the campaign, he said he was hopeful that elections would be free and fair. Since then, she has been staying in a rented house in Gulshan 2. The last time she cast her vote in an elec- tion was in general election, when she was a voter of the cantonment area. As her party boycotted the general election, she did not get to cast her vote. As we have not been able to sit together, we have not been able to make a decision in this regard. Asked about army deployment, the RAB chief said that decision would be taken by the Election Commission. Awami League-backed mayoral aspirant Sayeed Khokon yesterday said he would ac- cept the city corporation election result even if it showed his defeat. Local Awami League leaders joined the cam- paign. After Sayedabad, Khokon went to Jatrabari and campaigned there, urging people to cast their ballots for him. Another Awami League-backed mayoral candidate, Annisul Huq, said during his cam- paign that he has capability, experience, hon- esty and enthusiasm for work. I will meet you Tues- day night if I win the elections. Otherwise, you will see me on Wednesday morning where I will welcome the winner with garlands. He also described how he would solve sev- eral problems step by step. Annisul also displayed a model of future Dhaka featuring all the amenities of a modern city. He said he would implement the model if elected the mayor. I trust you and I hope you will not

Afroza to accept results, conditionally Afroza Abbas, wife of BNP-backed Dhaka south mayoral candidate Mirza Abbas, yesterday promised to accept the election results if it is deemed free and fair by the people and the media. She hoped that her husband, now in hiding, would win the election if the voters are not barred from exercising their franchise freely. Accusing the government of not granting the bail petition of Abbas, who is a former minister, Afroza said she had got huge response from the residents of Dhaka south. She again demanded deployment of army with judicial power. As a result, voters grow to distrust us.
