Her mother died from cancer 10 months and 1 week ago, and now her father has moved their family from suburban Cincinnati to a ramshackle house in Ohio. They have barely made it in the front door of their new house when their neighbours turn up offering a hot meal and some help unloading the removal van. The Millers are different though - they are Amish. Sneaking away, she meets up with him of an evening in some cornfields, and their love blossoms. Things come to a head when they are caught kissing though, and now a decision must be made; can Rose really give up everything to be with Noah? Or is their relationship just fated not to be? This is to me a bit of a Romeo and Juliet story to me - boy and girl who have to overcome immense obstacles and pressure from their parents to be together. She instantly connects with Noah the moment she sees him, and knows that he is the boy for her. Noah is an interesting character, but he really does have some real chauvinistic ideas due to his Amish upbringing. I have to say that I smiled when they had their first kiss. I understand that he has had a very different upbringing, but he really was just unbelievable at times! I must say that I was close to tears, which was pretty awkward considering that I was reading that part at the bus station! Overall; I enjoyed this book, was pleased with the way it ended, and am interested to read that there is a sequel in the works! Considering all the Christian books out there dealing with this topic, in particular. So, I honestly came into this book not knowing too much about them. Hopkins accurately portrayed what would happen in such a situation as this. Noah and Rose had an instant connection. Or, some would call it "love-at-first-sight". I think that, oftentimes, they were both ruled by their hormones teenagers!! Her father, a doctor, managed to get a job close by. When the local Amish community welcomes them in, hoping to get to know the new doctor, Noah and Rose get their first introduction. But, for Rose, where does the chivalry end and the chauvinism begin? will have some hurdles to overcome. Half-way through the book I realized that this story can only end one of three ways. It was interesting to see the journey Rose and Noah took, while so young, to get to this "ending". All-in-all this was a great story. I really enjoyed how realistic the author portrayed Rose, as a normal--sometimes very emotional--sixteen-year-old girl, and Noah as a more mature--but, slightly, impatient--eighteen-year-old boy. I think that she did great job with research because everything with the Amish seemed authentic, and it felt like I was being immersed into another culture. The dual perspective felt really well done, and I appreciated being able to see both sides of the story. The girl, the outsider, and the boy, the Amish who fell for the wild outsider. I totally understand where they were coming from, and it seems authentic that when you are that caught up in love, that you would abandon all else. I connected with both characters, even when they were being idiots. But other times, standing up for herself and trying out things her own way, she did. My romance book club is doing this category challenge designed to broaden our reading horizons, however, and one of the categories is "Amish romance. My suspicions were on fleek: I was cool with that, and hoping to learn about the Amish community and maybe enjoy a fluffy but unrealistic love story shared between two teens. Instead, I got a pretty unhealthy, almost emotionally abusive relationship between two horribly unlikable characters, with a side order of misogyny, slut-shaming, and bad life choices. The jealous Amish girl who wants to court Noah calls Rose a "hure. Oh, I think so. The abusive relationship Noah makes Rose feel bad about herself in an attempt to sway her to his way of thinking. I suddenly say not only my family as an obstacle to a marriage with Rose but also her family, and especially her older brother. I had underestimated his interest in the matter When she fights him about converting to being Amish, he slut-shames her. Then it gets disturbing. He starts thinking about ways to force her - and her family - to marry her to him. He considers impregnating her to force a shotgun marriage. Another idea had briefly penetrated my brain - getting her with child. My folks and her dad would be forced to allow us to marry But Noah thinks the baby idea is a great one, and proposes it to Rose, who gets upset. When she refuses, he has this to say: Likewise, Noah considers courting Ella from his community - the girl who called Rose "hure" - but is repulsed by their kiss and ends up ditching her and their families early. Rose is so distraught at the thought of losing him forever that she immediately gives in to all his terms, agreeing not just to converting to being Amish but also: The book cheerfully ends with Rose getting sent off to live with another Amish family to prepare for her conversion to Amish life. I really tried to read this with an open mind. It made me angry and frustrated. Rose was such an awful character. Noah was an annoying, manipulative character. The treatment of all the female characters was abhorrent. They were the only truly likable characters in here. You may very well feel differently, and if that is the case, I respect you for it. However, if the quotes I provided upset you or annoy you, you should probably find a different Amish book to read. What do you guys think?
