All of East Texas also lies within the Gulf Coastal Plain , but with less uniformity than the climate with rolling hills in the north and flat coastal plains in the south. Local vegetation also varies from north to south with the lower third consisting of the temperate grassland extending from South Texas to South Louisiana. The Piney Woods are part of a much larger region of pine - hardwood forest that extends into Louisiana , Arkansas , and Oklahoma. The Piney Woods thins out as it nears the Gulf of Mexico. West of the Piney Woods are the ranchlands and remnant oak forests of the East Central Texas forests ecoregion. The Brazos cuts through the southwest portion of the region while the Red River forms its northern border with Oklahoma and a portion of Arkansas. In East Texas and the rest of the South, small rivers and creeks collect into swamps called " Bayous " and merge with the surrounding forest. Bald cypress and Spanish moss are the dominant plants in bayous. The most famous of these bayous are Cypress Bayou and Buffalo Bayou. They flow east into Caddo Lake and the adjoining wetlands cover the rim and islands of the lake. Culture[edit] East Texas is often considered the westernmost extension of the Deep South. The predominant cultural influence comes from customs and traditions passed down from European-American and African-American Southerners who settled the region during the mid and late 19th century. African Americans were first brought to the area as enslaved workers for the plantations. These influences are noticeable in the sub-dialect of Texan English that is spoken throughout the region. According to the most recent linguistic studies, East Texans tend to pronounce Southern English with the drawl typical of the Lower South , whereas other parts of Texas are more prone to the "twang" of the Upper South, orâ€”depending upon demographic influences of the particular areaâ€”with some Hispanic and Midwestern traits. East Texas lacks the strong influence of late 19th and early 20th century European immigrants from Germany and Central Europe. Similarly, the new waves of immigrants since the late 20th century, primarily from India , other Asian nations, and Latin America , and their influences, have been less prevalent in East Texas. East Texans are predominantly Protestant Christians , expressing their faith as members of many denominations: Catholicism continues to have influence, particularly with an increased Hispanic population in recent decades. Other religions with smaller numbers, but with adherents in East Texas, include Mormonism and Judaism. Significant numbers of people of Cajun and Creole descent have come from Louisiana , although most are assimilated partially or completely into East Texas culture adopting the local culture and losing, to varying degrees, their original culture. This assimilation pattern has often historically included conversion from Catholicism to Protestant faiths. United States settlers from the Protestant Southeast practiced some discrimination against Cajun and Creole migrants, a cultural attitude that persisted until quite recently. Despite the tendency towards assimilation, Cajun and Creole cuisine for example, jambalaya and catfish gumbo , are popular in the region. Many East Texans, including those without Louisiana roots, are known to be expert at preparing at least some well-known Louisiana dishes. While some East Texans associate with cowboy culture, most identify more with plantation traditions of the South than with the expansive cattle ranching of the plains regions of Texas. However, it is common for East Texans to own and trade cattle. There are several "sale barns" across East Texas with weekly and monthly trades, as is common in other parts of the lower South. In the northern part of East Texas, awareness of the native and historical Caddo Mississippian culture remains significant. East Texans enjoy a range of music that is influenced by gospel, bluegrass, blues, rock, country, soul, rhytm and blues, Cajun, etc. Worldwide-acclaimed pianist Van Cliburn , a native of nearby Shreveport, Louisiana , was raised in Kilgore. Kilgore College houses the Van Cliburn Auditorium on its home campus. Many high school bands in East Texas continue the tradition of military-style marching, unlike other parts of the state. Sports and outdoors[edit] As with other parts of Texas, high school football is king in East Texas. Residents of East Texas towns and rural communities fill high school stadiums in support of their local team, cheerleaders, bands, etc. Many East Texas high school teams have won Texas state championships and have produced collegiate and professional football players. Don Meredith , who famously played for the Dallas Cowboys , played at Mt.

Dez Bryant , a football product from Lufkin, is a current wide receiver for the Dallas Cowboys. Adrian Peterson , a star running back for the Minnesota Vikings , played high school football in Palestine. Other high school sports are popular in East Texas including basketball, baseball, volleyball, softball and track. A significant number of East Texas youth participate in Little League Baseball , soccer and softball. Church leagues are quite common in providing opportunities for basketball and softball for youth and adults alike. In recent years, cowboy churches have grown in number and offer rodeo events for their youth. Homer Bryce Stadium East Texans also enjoy collegiate athletic competition. East Texas is also home to the Kilgore College Rangerettes , a world-famous dance team which debuted in 1937. A few professional sports teams are located in East Texas. There are great party beaches such as Galveston Island East Beach and quiet deserted ones like Boca Chica on South Padre Island, Texas where people go for solitude, romance and to enjoy unspoiled nature. Boca Chica There are many spectacularly beautiful beaches on South Padre Island, some lively, others quiet and deserted, but Boca Chica Beach manages to stay empty of crowds, clean, and beautiful. It has completely escaped development and has only a few stilt houses and a jetty sticking out into the Gulf of Mexico. Although Boca Chica is a state park Texas beach, it has no park facilities at all. What it does have is miles of fine sand beaches, clear water, and great swimming, snorkeling, fishing, kiteboarding, and birdwatching. It is a perfect spot to get away from the crowds and noise. It is the place where the best parties are held and where there are concerts, festivals, and events of all kinds going on the whole summer. There is a popular sandcastle building competition every year and like very few beaches on Galveston Island, booze is allowed as long as it is not in a glass container. During the quiet season, when it is mostly deserted, Island East Beach is perfect for long walks, great fishing, and bird watching. The efforts to deepen the harbor resulted in a shift in the current and the accumulation of sand in a series of jetties that were consequently filled up to form a beach. The beach is a designated bird sanctuary, so try to spot some colorful birds while you are walking. Fishing is permitted everywhere except at the saltwater pool and at the boat dock. One of the main attractions on the beach is the 1,foot-long Horace Caldwell Pier that extends deep into the Gulf of Mexico. It offers great spot for fishing and has shops selling and renting bait and tackle. There are picnic sites with cabanas and tables all along the beach. The beach is huge, with miles of fine sand, perfect for long walks, swimming, snorkeling, playing volleyball, or just hanging about. The town beach is an 8-mile-long stretch of fine sand, much smaller than many Texan beaches, but quiet and peaceful and perfect for family day under the sun. Some parts of the beach are accessible by car, usually filled with passionate anglers partaking in a spot of surf fishing. For those who want to spice things up, there are gambling boats a short drive from Magnolia Beach. The whole area is great for shelling, bird watching, and crabbing. There is a small fishing pier and a public boat launch, and the nearby marina sells bait, offers deep-sea fishing charters, and serves a great lunch. There are acres of dunes and coastal marshes with thousands of birds, offering one of the best bird watching areas in the country. Horseback riding on the beach is a unique experience. There are many campsites of all types, the beautiful Redfish Hall you can rent for birthdays, weddings or any other celebration, a small shop, a kayak rental shop, and a shaded group picnic area with grills and picnic tables. Mustang Island An mile long barrier island near Port Aransas, the whole of Mustang Island is a state park with five miles of spectacular sandy beach. Before ranching took over, the island was famous for the mustang horses that roamed the island freely and gave the island its name. Visitors usually spend their time on the island swimming, bird watching, or collecting shells. When the wind picks up, there are surfers enjoying the waves, and when the wind dies down, kayaking and paddleboarders take over. Fishing from the jetties or wading through the shallows often results with surprising number of fish. It is also possible to charter a deep fishing boat. Walking around and enjoying the dunes and the birds that make their home here is a wonderful experience. This park was developed to protect more than 70 miles of majestic coastline, huge dunes, prairies, and tidal flats as well as the wildlife that make their home there. Take the paved scenic Grasslands Nature Trail to see the unspoiled nature, the way it looked hundreds of years ago, or take your off-road vehicle along the beach, or take a tour of the island with one of the park rangers and learn about its history and environment.

Port Aransas Beach Once known for its pirates in the 18th century, Port Aransas is a small town on Mustang Island known for its great fishing, its 18 miles of long sandy beach and a large number of Texas beach resorts. It is the only town on Mustang Island, one of the longest Texas coast barrier islands. This sleepy small town swells to over 60,000 people during the spring break and summer, when the tourists come to swim, snorkel, fish, watch birds, hike the dunes, golf, bodysurf, play volleyball, surf, boogie board, and have a good time. Its beach is famous for the Sand Fest, an annual sand castles competition that turns into a large festival. High Island High Island is a small, quiet East Texas town, not popular with students coming on a spring break or with those looking for a location of their second home. It is the kind of place many people imagine East Texas to look like. It is located at the edge of a vast marsh, with twisted oaks clinging to the rims of salt domes at times 40 feet high above the Gulf. The beach has nothing but coarse sand that stretches for miles towards Louisiana, dotted with colorful shells, often deserted, sometimes visited by riders cooling horses in the surf. Only an hour and a half from Houston, it is the perfect beach for those who want solitude and unspoiled nature. There are four bird sanctuaries nearby. The largest is Smith Oaks Sanctuary, with four lakes and a lovely rookery with herons, egrets, roseate spoonbills, and cormorants. This privately owned island was originally a ranch, but is today mostly a wildlife sanctuary and a paradise for beach goers and bird lovers. The heart of the island is off limits, and visitors can only enjoy the public portion of the island – the beach below the line where the vegetation starts. Not to worry, that is where you can enjoy the best bird watching, fishing, shelling, and strolling along the beach. The beach is 21 miles long with fine white sand and covered with thousands of colorful shells, some of them rare. No cars are allowed on the beach, unusual for Texas beaches. Fishing on the island is so great that it is called the "Fishing Capital of Texas. Often much less crowded than other nearby beaches, it is a pleasant and safe alternative to bring the kids to play in the sand. Quiet and peaceful, the beach is great for swimming, snorkeling, building sand castles and, of course, fishing. While surf fishing is popular and great fun, the fishing is best right off the jetty. You are likely to catch trout, grouper, kingfish, and at times even tarpon. Be careful when swimming, the jetty can cause strong riptides. South Packery Channel Beach It is a barrier island on the Gulf of Mexico, a popular escape spot for busy urban people, and perfect for lazy rests on the golden sands, relaxing sunsets with a fruity cocktail, or fishing for that biggest fish ever. The island is connected to the mainland by the Queen Isabella Causeway. The town has more than 4 miles of beaches popular for horseback riding and walking. There are very few services on the beach and there are signs about the water quality, so check before going swimming. It is about a mile and half long but quite narrow and surrounded by large dunes, so you can find a nice shelter from the wind for a family picnic.
