A few years ago, I started a "Life List of Quilts". This is a list of all the people I want to make a quilt for in my lifetime. As I make a quilt for someone, I take a picture of it and save it in a binder.

The EQ8 is redesigned with a friendly new look that includes large interface elements for faster, more intuitive learning. It comes with more than 40 new and updated features, and the package contains a software download license that is used to claim, download, and install the software from ElectricQuilt. Complete instructions are included. How will this course help me? Joanie will teach you that there are many correct answers to the perfect quilting design for any quilt. Chapter 2 : TLQVP - Quilting Machines

Finding Quilting Charm Packs. For those of you new to quilting, a Charm Pack is a collection of 5" x 5" squares of fabric. Usually they come in packs of 45 - 48 squares.

I realized they also wanted to know how they would spend their time. After all teachers have a hurried, jam-packed schedule filled with children, bells, and the latest teaching trend. They think of themselves as teachers. Besides teaching I was a writer. Mostly I wrote teaching and parenting articles. However, I had an idea for a book that had nothing to do with teaching and everything to do with quilting. I went to a teaching friend I knew quilted, and asked if she would help me to learn enough to put it in my book. She took me by the arm, literally as well as figuratively, into my first quilting class. I did finish writing the book, *Our Family Quilt*, and I discovered quilting. Rhonda Cratty is a quilter and author of the book, *Our Family Quilt: The Fabric of Life*. I discovered that the art of quilting and writing work hand in hand to engage me thoughtfully in my work and made me healthier and happier every day. Contemporary quilt makers fall into two groups. The first group loves every step of the process: The second group loves the creative process of designing, picking fabric, and creating a one of a kind top. These artists often have stacks of UFOs Unfinished Objects because they are always ready to create a new design. For some of us the final step in the process is sharing our creative work. I love to give them as gifts, while many quilters share at quilt guild meetings, shows, online blogs, and magazines. The cover of *Our Family Quilt* was the first quilt Rhonda ever made – a log cabin design. I have met many quilting artists in guilds, bees, traveling, online, and through my book. They are happily engaged in their creative process – problem solvers who express themselves not only quilting but through a variety of media and activities as part of their everyday creativity. Quilting feeds creativity for life, and quilters find life feeds their creativity for quilting. I no longer think of myself as a teacher who writes. I think of myself as a quilter who writes. Everyday quilting describes my life. Whether planning, writing, blogging, cooking, or actually sitting down at my machine, in my mind I am quilter. As I wrote about Grace and Audrey, it inspired me to quilt. As I worked on my quilting craft it inspired chapters in *Our Family Quilt*. I am now writing the second book in the series. I find myself writing and thinking about quilting, then in reverse, when I am quilting – I am thinking about my writing. Studies have shown crafting can have a healing effect on the mind, but did you know the art of quilting may help restore or maintain your health? Unlike many other crafts, quilting can provide the sense of community that has been lost. A few generations ago, women held quilting bees to gather and work on quilts. Bonnie Wright, a retired occupational therapy assistant, found this support when quilting helped her adapt to her new home. After moving to Mount Cobb, Pa. You can take up more complex patterns or different skills as you want or as your body dictates.
