*Oct 31, Â. "According to preliminary information," Russia's National Anti-Terrorism Committee said in a statement, "the individual who entered the building took an unidentified object from his bag.*

Eyewitnesses say shots were fired and the Russian authorities are calling the incident a terrorist attack. An explosion shook the Polytechnic College in the city of Kerch in the Crimea earlier this afternoon. Several ambulance and rescue crews from nearby towns are at the scene, in addition to a helicopter. What we know about the attack in Crimea as of the morning of 18 October: At first, the incident was deemed a gas explosion. However, the press service of Krymgazset stated that the school was not connected to the gas network. Some witnesses reported a stranger entering the building and the sounds of shots being fired. Later, the National Anti-Terrorism Committee of Russia officially announced that an unidentified explosive device had been triggered in the building. No data on detainees or suspects has been released. The investigative committee of Russia has launched a criminal case looking into the explosion. Spokesman for the Russian President Dmitry Peskov said that the incident may be considered a terrorist attack. College student Vladimir confirmed the information pertaining to a possible shooting to Novaya Gazeta. Before the explosion, several shots rang out. I heard at least ten. It was not an automatic, rather single shots. I heard some stranger had entered the building, but I did not see him myself. An audio recording has been released on social media website VKontakte in which a girl, allegedly a student of the college, talks about what happened: We started to run â€¦ I bruised my hand. We ran, and the children lay down. I saw her fall and stop moving. I saw the boys fall and their blood scattered everywhere. I saw it all before my eyes.

Imron used the motorbike to plant the small bomb outside the U. Idris then rode the motorbike as Imron drove two suicide bombers in the Mitsubishi to the nightclub district in Kuta. He stopped near the Sari Club, instructed one suicide bomber to put on his explosives vest and the other to arm the vehicle bomb. Idris then left the second bomber, who had only learned to drive in a straight line, to drive the minivan the short distance to the Sari Club. Idris picked up Imron on the Yamaha and the duo headed back into Denpasar. Idris dialed the number of the Nokia to detonate the bomb at the Consulate. The two suicide bombers exploded their devices. Imron and Idris dropped the motorbike at a place where it eventually attracted the attention of the caretaker. Hundreds more people suffered horrific burns and other injuries. The largest group among those killed were holidayers from Australia with 88 fatalities. On 14 October, the United Nations Security Council passed Resolution condemning the attack as a threat to international peace and security. Awards[ edit ] There were many acts of individual heroism. James Parkinson, an emergency nurse, worked alongside Doctor Hogg from Wollongong in the Denpasar Sanglah Hospital running the trauma centre for the bombing victims. The Cross of Valour is the highest civilian honor and is equivalent to the Victoria Cross for Australia which is the highest military honor. The bomb[ edit ] The Mitsubishi L van bomb was initially thought to have consisted of C4 , a military grade plastic explosive which is difficult to obtain. However, investigators discovered the bomb was made from potassium chlorate , aluminium powder, and sulfur. In , Indonesian police arrested 24 additional people suspected of involvement in the Bali attacks and a bombing of the Marriott Hotel in Jakarta. Umar Patek was finally arrested in Abbottabad Pakistan in early Patek is a suspect in other bombings as well as the one in Bali. It was alleged that he tried to overthrow the government and establish an Islamic state. The specific charges against Bashir related to a series of church bombings on Christmas Eve in , and to a plot to bomb United States and other Western interests in Singapore. He was initially not charged over the Bali attack, although he was frequently accused of being the instigator or inspirer of the attack. On 2 September, Bashir was acquitted of treason but convicted of lesser charges and sentenced to a prison term of four years. He said he would appeal. On 15 October , he was arrested by the Indonesian authorities and charged with involvement in another bomb attack, which killed 14 people at the J. Marriott hotel in Jakarta on 5 August Secondary charges in this indictment accused him of involvement in the Bali bombing, the first time he faced charges in relation to this attack. On 3 March , Bashir was found not guilty of the charges surrounding the bombing, but guilty of conspiracy over the attacks in Bali. He was sentenced to two and a half years imprisonment. On 30 April , the first charges related to the Bali bombings were made against Amrozi bin Haji Nurhasyim, known as Amrozi, for allegedly buying the explosives and the van used in the bombings. On 8 August, he was found guilty and sentenced to death. Another participant in the bombing, Imam Samudra , was sentenced to death on 10 September. He also confessed that a fellow leader Riduan Isamuddin, known as Hambali, had provided the funds for the attacks. He told police, I do not know

for sure the source of the aforementioned money from Hambali; most probably it was from Afghanistan, that is, from Sheikh Usama bin Laden. As far as I know, Hambali did not have a source of funds except from Afghanistan. As noted below, all three were executed on 9 November. The Australian, US, and many other foreign governments expressed satisfaction with the speed and efficiency with which the Indonesian police and courts dealt with the bombings primary suspects, despite what they characterized as light sentences. The Australian government said it would not ask Indonesia to refrain from using the death penalty. He is in American custody in the Guantanamo Bay detention camp. Constitutional appeals[ edit ] On 23 July , one of the convicted bombers, Maskur Abdul Kadir , successfully appealed his conviction. He had been tried under retroactive laws which were introduced after the bombing and which were employed to aid the prosecution of those involved in the attack. These laws were used by the prosecution instead of existing criminal laws as they allowed the death penalty to be imposed and lowered certain evidentiary restrictions. The highest court in Indonesia, the Constitutional Court, found by a margin of five to four that trying the terrorist suspects under these retroactive laws violated Article 28I 1 of the constitution [2]. The minority judges argued that international human rights documents such as the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights allowed an exception to not applying retrospective legislation in the prosecution of crimes against humanity. The majority found that this argument was inconsistent with the text of Article 28I 1 which states that the rights listed there "cannot be limited under any circumstances. The legal status of Kadir, Idris and others who might have their convictions quashed following the ruling on the retrospective law is unclear. Execution of perpetrators[ edit ] On 24 October , Bali officials announced that three men convicted of carrying out the bombings would be executed by firing squad in November. Denpasar court official Nengah Sanjaya said the 3-page appeal would be sent to a Cilacap , central Java court. Local chief prosecutor Muhammad Yamin said they would be "executed simultaneously" but at different locations. Allahu Akbar , or "God is great! The execution caused high tension and sparked clashes in Tenggulan between hundreds of police and supporters. After praying with the crowd, she spent half an hour in the house of the executed man and spoke with his mother. That can only be in a war and Indonesia is not at war. In line with the return of tourism to Kuta, Kuta Karnival has grown into a tourism promotional event with major coverage from television and newspapers from across the globe. Companies, embassies, Non-Government Organizations, associations and even individuals come forth to get involved in the various events such as a Balinese dance competition presented by a surf-wear company, an environment exhibition presented by an embassy, a fun cycle presented by a group of individuals, a seminar presented by an association and a parade on the streets presented by an NGO. Tourists and locals alike, more than ninety thousand people participates in the numerous events, year after year. Kuta Karnival is conducted to commemorate and give respect to the victims of human violence and show the world the true spirit of local community survival despite terrorism attacks. On 12 October , Australian and Indonesian survivors of the bombings attended a solemn commemoration service to mark the eighth anniversary of the devastating attacks.

When we got outside the arena there were dozens of police vans and quite a few ambulances. Aerial view of Manchester Arena attack A mother, at the concert with her two daughters, described seeing a man she believes to have been the suicide bomber. It was that which stood out because it was so intense among the crowds of people. As quick as I saw it the explosion happened. I saw the remains of the torso and the remains of the body. Sikh temples and hotels offered refuge and some locals opened up their homes. Some taxi drivers waived their fares. The attack happened despite years of warnings and tightening of security, especially around crowded places. Investigators will want to find out the reason for the attack, where the material for the suspected device was bought and how it was designed. Since the attack on London in , measures have been put in place to restrict the purchase of materials that can be used to make homemade explosives. The Manchester attack came after weeks of heightened activity and disrupted plots by police and MI5. In March, four people and the attacker died after an attack in Westminster, central London, which targeted the Houses of Parliament. The terrorist threat level for Britain is at severe, meaning an attack is highly likely. The government is not planning to increase the threat level to critical. However, security is expected to be reviewed for major venues in Britain and elsewhere. The Metropolitan police commissioner, Cressida Dick, said the extra presence, including armed officers, would continue for as long as needed. She also said the force was working with all those planning events this weekend to ensure all necessary steps had been taken. Security was also stepped up in Scotland, where the chief constable deployed armed police on high visibility patrols in crowded areas, airports and railway stations. In a statement just before 3am, Hopkins said the police had received reports of an explosion at We are doing all that we can, working with local and national agencies to support those affected as we gather information about what happened last night. Farook was born in the United States and Malik was a Pakistani immigrant. The two were killed by police. In calls made during his rampage, Mateen pledged allegiance to Isis. He was killed by police. Sayfullo Saipov, a year-old immigrant from Uzbekistan, has pleaded not guilty to murder. Thank you for your feedback. On Monday, travellers reacted with bemusement, relief and some humor. Danny Nguyen, 24, heard the explosion while he waited for a bus home to Philadelphia. He said police ran into the station. She said she was going to make the best of her extra time in New York. The attack interrupted nearly every subway line and some trains were evacuated, putting even more strain on a subway system that has been heavily criticized for long delays and frequent train breakdowns. Many New Yorkers were unfazed. Shaun Henderson was on the F train after the explosion and said he was just happy the trains were working, even if he was going to be late for work. Though witnesses described panic immediately after the explosion, shortly after the attack the scene was calm.

A large police presence was spotted soon after the explosion in a section of Brooklyn that boasts a significant Bangladeshi population. Profiles[ edit ] A total of five attackers were involved, with three of them dying in suicide bombings and the remaining two arrested in the weeks after. All had involvement in the planning and organization of the November Paris attacks. They were identified and named as: Committed a suicide bombing at Brussels Airport. In , he had been involved in an attempted robbery at a currency exchange office and a subsequent shootout with police that left one officer injured. He was sentenced to 10 years in prison but was paroled in under the condition that he did not leave the country; he was sought by authorities when he violated those conditions. He reportedly travelled to Syria in , under a false ID. Abrini assisted Ibrahim El Bakraoui and Najim Laachraoui in the airport bombings but failed to detonate his bomb. Arrested on 8 April He was a childhood friend of brothers Salah Abdeslam and Brahim Abdeslam, who were both involved in the November attacks in Paris, and is suspected of assisting Salah Abdeslam in his escape following the attacks. He is also suspected of having fought for the Islamic State in Syria. Committed the suicide bombing at the Maalbeek metro station. In , he was convicted of several carjackings, the possession of a number of Kalashnikov rifles , and a bank robbery and kidnapping. After being released in , El Bakraoui failed to appear for his parole appointments and abandoned his address. He was later served with three arrest warrants, one from Interpol , one international, and one European. Krayem assisted Khalid El Bakraoui in the suicide bombing at the metro station. When he was eleven, he participated in a Swedish documentary film about the integration of migrants into Swedish society. Krayem is believed to have been radicalized by videos of Anwar al-Awlaki , and to have been fighting for ISIL since In security camera video of Brussels Airport, Ibrahim El Bakraoui, Laachraoui, and Abrini [49] were seen pushing suitcases believed to have contained the bombs that exploded in the departure hall. A taxi driver who drove them to the airport said he tried to help the men with their luggage but they ordered him away. The authorities received a tip-off from a taxi driver once they released photos of the suspects several hours after the attacks. As of 26 March, twelve men had been arrested in connection with the bombings. It reads, in French, "Stay where you are, avoid all movement, prioritise communications by SMS or social networks. The largest message says translated from French , Brussels is beautiful, with further inscriptions of Stop violence, Stop war, Unity, and Humanity. Authorities temporarily halted air traffic to the airport and evacuated the terminal buildings. Controlled explosions were carried out on suspicious objects around Maalbeek station. All trains from Paris to Brussels were also cancelled. Taxis in Brussels transported passengers free-of-charge for the duration of the lockdown. On 29 March, an operational test was performed. The official reopening date was scheduled to be announced on 30 March. A temporary terminal was planned for use after the reopening. Belgian Interior Minister Jan Jambon stated that the governing parties had agreed to update the law in The Lejeune law first came under scrutiny after serial killer and child molester Marc Dutroux was released from prison in On that day, a Brussels Airlines flight left for Faro and a flight to Athens and Turin was scheduled for the same day. Upon reopening, only passengers were allowed to enter a temporary departure hall and security checkpoints were implemented at the roadway to the airport. Only car and taxi traffic were allowed to enter but public transit remained suspended. They expressed their desire to spread a religious message of unity throughout Belgium, and to combat extremism. Embassy in Brussels warned of the possibility of more attacks, recommending " sheltering in place and avoiding all public transportation". It was a terror incident in London where five people were killed, including a police officer and the attacker, and dozens were injured. Reactions to the Brussels bombings Eiffel Tower illuminated with the colour of Belgium flag The sculpture Flight in Mind by Belgian artist Olivier Strebelle was damaged in the attacks. After some months of restoration the sculpture was relocated to an outdoor area of the airport. It is seen here on the 1st anniversary of the attacks. He offered their full support to members of the emergency and security services. Also, hashtags such as ikwilhelpen Iwanttohelp and PorteOuverte Opendoor were used by Brussels residents who wanted to offer shelter and assistance for people who might need help. Similarly, reactions to the November Paris attacks were viewed as disproportionate in comparison to those of earlier

bombings in Beirut. The Commission also pointed to the structural under-funding of the security services, noting how a lack of resources and manpower left the police and intelligence services unable to process all the information about the great number of Belgian foreign fighters. In the hours following the attack, people started gathering at the city center near the former stock exchange Place de la Bourse. Mourners wrote chalk messages on the pavement and buildings surrounding the square. Numerous messages and mementos, usually every-day objects such as mugs or hats, were left at the Bourse memorial. According to Ana Milosevic, a researcher at KU Leuven, societal tensions and the pressure for the answers about the causes and consequences of the attacks, were salient in the first days and weeks after the event. During the two months of the existence, the Bourse memorial was used as a site of contestation and negotiation of the meanings associated with the terrorist attacks. Over two months, the team of the archives documented the process of memorialization, also collecting some of the memorabilia left by the mourners. Called "The Flame of Hope", the monument was placed at the main square of the municipality, however it did not attract significant societal or media attention. Following a public competition, [] a monument to the victims was unveiled on the first anniversary of the attacks on the pedestrianised section of rue de la Loi, between Schuman and the parc du Cinquantenaire. The monument, by Jean-Henri Compere, is called "Wounded But Still Standing in Front of the Inconceivable" and is constructed from two metre 66 foot long horizontal surfaces rising skywards.
