This is after comparing the smell of Durian to no less than 13 different items; really, after "stale vomit" I got the idea. Maybe a sentence or two like this, for seasoning, would liven a book. But sentence after sentence, paragraph after paragraph The thing is, it could. About halfway through, the book settles down into a study of bizarre people and even more bizarre fruit.
