Additionally, we work because we enjoy what we doâ€not because we need the money. This is the extraordinary privilege of financial independence. On Parenting My parenting philosophy is that everyone should do what works for them. Every family is different and every kid is different. I share stories of how we parent â€just as I share stories of how we manage our money â€to offer insight into our alternative approach to life. Relevant to this conversation, I have no animus towards those who choose to be full-time stay-at-home parents or full-time working-outside-of-the-home parents or any configuration therein. Conversely, I work exclusively for myself and as a freelancer, which means I have no boss except myself! We chose this schedule because I wanted to quit my 9-to-5 and be the primary caregiver. While this might, at first blush, appear to conform to traditional gender roles, I assure you nothing about our relationship is conservative or regressive. FW and I are both feminists committed to an egalitarian partnership and it was my express desire to transition into this role. I also want to note that I built up my freelance work prior to staying home with Babywoods, which made the transition easier. However, you could also do so after welcoming a child into your family. Just as my frugality adapts and morphs with each new iteration of life, so too does my work-at-home and parenting process. If we have more children, our schedule will certainly metamorphose yet again. The key is that we have a set of guidelines to follow no matter how our family grows or changes. I shower daily and wear somewhat clean clothes. Note that I did not mention brushing my hair. I could afford to send my daughter to daycare and I could afford not to work, but I keep her at home and I work because those are the things I want to do. Since she naps at roughly the same times everyday mid-morning and mid-afternoon , I carefully plan and prepare for those naptimes. As soon as Mr. My grocery store chore helper. This means I stick to an editorial calendar nothing fancy, I just use a free Google calendar for everything here on Frugalwoods as well as my freelance and volunteer work. I also prepare my physical environment in advance of naptime. For example, I make my lunch while I give Babywoods her lunch. I pull my salad out of the fridge and sit down at my computer. FW always gets Babywoods out of her crib in the morning and then he always takes the dog out and makes breakfast. We do have our spontaneous momentsâ€like a last minute decision one morning last week to take a day trip to a thrift store and a breweryâ€but generally, we do the same things on the same days each week. My behavioral guidebooks, which advocate for routines: By having an outlet for my creativity and interestsâ€separate and independent from my childâ€I am able to care for her with more energy and enthusiasm. I need this outlet in addition to the rewards of parenting, which is why this format is perfect for me. Another element of our parenting philosophy is encouraging independent play. For example, we do not take Babywoods out to restaurants for dinner. Because that would not be setting ourselves up for success. She goes to bed early, she eats dinner early, and dining out at dinnertime is a terrible idea although lunchtime totally works for her. Having immaculate hair and clothes and makeup does not matter to me and so I spend very little time getting ready in the morning anyone who has ever come over to my house can attest to thisâ€¦. Having a clean home, however, is a great deal more important to me, so I spend some time cleaning every day. Hiking , on the other hand, is a staple of my everyday routine. But the reality is many of these jobs are scams. You end up paying for starter kits or certifications that are useless, find your credit card is charged without your permission, or get caught up in a fake check scam. People tricked by work-at-home ads have lost thousands of dollars, not to mention their time and energy. Other work-at-home offers tell you that you can make money doing tasks like internet searches on prominent search engines and filling out forms. You just have to pay a small shipping and handling fee. If you pay them even a tiny fee online, they can use your financial information to put additional charges on your card. But after you pay, you find out there is no work. Instead, you get a letter telling you to get other people to buy the same envelope-stuffing opportunity or some other product. You earn money only if those people respond the same way you did.

Assembly or craft work You see an ad that says you can make money assembling crafts or other products at home for a company that has promised to buy them. You may have to invest hundreds of dollars for equipment or supplies – like a sewing or sign-making machine from the company, or materials to make items like aprons, baby shoes, or plastic signs.

Rebate processing The ad says you can earn money by helping to process rebates. What you get instead are poorly written and useless training materials. There are no rebates to process, and few people ever get a refund.

Medical billing The ads promise a substantial income for full- or part-time work processing medical claims electronically – no experience needed. When you call the toll-free number, a sales rep tells you doctors are eager for help. But the companies rarely provide experienced sales staff or contacts in the medical community. The software they send might not even work. Competition in the medical billing market is fierce, and few people who make the investment are able to find clients or generate any income – let alone get back their investment.

Mystery shopping Ads for mystery shoppers say they want people who are willing to shop at certain stores or dine at certain restaurants, and then report on their experience in exchange for money. While there are some legitimate mystery shopping jobs, many are scams. Scammers might tell you that you need to pay for worthless certifications, directories, or job guarantees. You should never have to pay to get into the mystery shopping business.

Multilevel marketing Another type of work-at-home opportunity is a multilevel marketing MLM plan. But not all multilevel marketing plans are legitimate. But are their claims for real? Be wary and ask for written information about how much money most people make after deducting their expenses. MLMs that survive on recruiting new participants rather than retail sales are pyramid schemes. Pyramid schemes are illegal, and the vast majority of participants lose money. It still could be a scam. Under the Rule, sellers have to give you a one-page disclosure document that offers key pieces of information about the opportunity. Use the information in the disclosure document to fact-check what the seller tells you. In addition to reviewing the disclosure document, here are some questions to ask: What tasks will I have to perform? Are any other steps involved? Will I be paid a salary, or will I be paid on commission? What is the basis for your claims about my likely earnings? Do you survey everyone who purchased the program? What documents can you show me to prove your claims are true before I give you any money? If a seller makes a claim about how much money a person can earn, the seller also has to give you an earnings claim statement with more specifics. Who will pay me? When will I get my first paycheck? What is the total cost of this work-at-home program, including supplies, equipment, and membership fees? What will I get for my money? Read what others have to say. You also might try checking out a company with your local consumer protection agency, your state Attorney General, or the Better Business Bureau – not only where the company is located, but also where you live. Dishonest companies sometimes settle complaints and change their names or move to avoid detection.

Report a Scam If you have spent money and time on a work-at-home program and now believe it might not be legitimate, contact the company and ask for a refund. Let company representatives know that you plan to notify law enforcement officials about your experience. The advertising manager of the publication that ran the ad.
