

Chapter 1 : West Hollywood calls for Trump Walk of Fame star's removal - CNNPolitics

Approximately 20 new stars are added to the Walk each year. Four identical circular moons, bearing the names of the three astronauts Neil A. Armstrong , Edwin E. The moons are silver and grey terrazzo circles rimmed in brass on a square pink terrazzo background, with the television emblem inlaid at the top of each circle. The Dolby Theatre is in the foreground at left. In the upper left quadrant is the famous intersection of Hollywood and Highland Center. The Hollywood Chamber of Commerce credits E. Stuart, its volunteer president in , with the original idea for creating a Walk of Fame. Stuart reportedly proposed the Walk as a means to "maintain the glory of a community whose name means glamour and excitement in the four corners of the world. By the basic concept and general design had been agreed upon, and plans were submitted to the Los Angeles City Council. Multiple accounts exist for the origin of the star concept. According to one, the historic Hollywood Hotel "which stood for more than 50 years on Hollywood Boulevard at the site now occupied by the Hollywood and Highland complex and the Dolby formerly Kodak Theatre [16]" displayed stars on its dining room ceiling above the tables favored by its most famous celebrity patrons, and that may have served as an early inspiration. Toberman , the legendary real estate developer known as "Mr. Hollywood", because the colors clashed with a new building he was erecting on Hollywood Boulevard. The committees met at the Brown Derby restaurant, [21] and included such prominent names as Cecil B. As a result, the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences was formed for the purpose of creating a separate award system for the music business. In the Los Angeles City Council passed an ordinance naming the Hollywood Chamber of Commerce "the agent to advise the City" about adding names to the Walk, and the Chamber, over the following six years, devised rules, procedures, and financing methods to do so. Zanuck was awarded the first star in eight years in a presentation ceremony hosted by Danny Thomas. At left is Gene Kelly. Radio personality, television producer and Chamber member Johnny Grant is generally credited with implementing the changes that resuscitated the Walk and established it as a significant tourist attraction. His unique special-category star, with its emblem depicting a stylized "Great Seal of the City of Hollywood", [41] is located at the entrance to the Dolby Theatre adjacent to Johnny Grant Way. The damage ranged from minor cosmetic flaws caused by normal weathering to holes and fissures severe enough to constitute a walking hazard. Alana Semuels of the Los Angeles Times described it as "just the latest corporate attempt to buy some good buzz," and, quoting an area brand strategist, "I think Johnny Grant would roll over in his grave. Gene Autry is the only honoree with stars in all five categories. He was unanimously voted into the initial group of in but the Selection Committee ultimately excluded him, ostensibly due to questions regarding his morals he had been charged with violating the Mann Act "and exonerated" during the White Slavery hysteria of the [62] , but more likely due to his left-leaning political views. His star was finally added to the Walk in , the same year he received his Academy Award ; [24] but even then, 16 years later, the Chamber of Commerce received angry letters from across the country protesting its decision to include him. The answer is no The Hollywood Walk of Fame is a registered historic landmark. Once a star has been added to the Walk, it is considered a part of the historic fabric of the Hollywood Walk of Fame. Because of this, we have never removed a star from the Walk. The Mayor of West Hollywood, John Duran, stated that "the council unanimously passes the resolution to remove his star"; however, the West Hollywood City Council has no jurisdiction over the Walk of Fame. There are two Harrison Ford stars, honoring the silent film actor at Hollywood Boulevard , and the present-day actor in front of the Dolby Theatre at Hollywood Boulevard.

When the recording artist Jackson died in , fans mistakenly began leaving flowers, candles, and other tributes at the Vine Street star. George Eastman as mentioned ; Thomas Edison , inventor of the first true film projector and holder of numerous patents related to motion-picture technology; Lee de Forest , inventor of the vacuum tube , which made radio and TV possible, and Phonofilm , which made sound movies possible; Merian C. A few star recipients moved on after their entertainment careers to political notability. Reagan is also one of two Governors of California with a star; the other is Arnold Schwarzenegger. Ignacy Paderewski , who served as Prime Minister of Poland between the World Wars, is the only European head of government represented. While not technically part of the Hollywood Walk of Fame a city ordinance prohibits putting corporate names on sidewalks , the star was installed adjacent to the Walk of Fame, and was thought of by Johnny Grant , the proverbial "Mayor of Hollywood. The star inscribed Charlie Tuna honors not the animated advertising mascot, but Art Ferguson, the long-time radio personality and game show announcer. Other fictional characters on the Walk include the Munchkins as mentioned , two individual Muppets Kermit the Frog and Big Bird and the Muppets as a group, one monster Godzilla , and three non-animated canine characters Strongheart , Lassie , and Rin Tin Tin. Star locations[edit] Locations of individual stars are not necessarily random or arbitrary. Decisions are occasionally made with a dollop of whimsy: Honorees may request a specific location for their star, although final decisions remain with the Chamber. The theater manager fired her on the spot for "insubordination" and humiliated her by stripping the epaulets from her uniform in the theater lobby. The mistake was fixed, but years later the television actor Dan Haggerty of Grizzly Adams fame, no relation to Don also received a star. The confusion eventually sprouted an urban legend that Dan Haggerty was the only honoree to have a star removed from the Walk of Fame. The star was finally remade with the correct name in Theft and vandalism[edit] Acts of vandalism occur on the Walk on a regular basis, ranging from profanity and political statements written on stars with markers to attempted removal of brass emblems with chisels. Police recovered them in the suburban community of South Gate when they arrested a man involved in an incident there and searched his house. The suspect was a construction worker employed on the Hollywood and Vine project. The stars had been badly damaged, and had to be remade. Johnny Grant later received an anonymous phone tip that the missing star was in Iowa, but it was never found. The star was replaced almost immediately, but the original was never recovered and the perpetrators never caught. He readily admitted to the vandalism, which he described as "civil disobedience" and "freedom of expression", and told reporters that he originally planned to remove the entire star and auction it to raise money for the women who accused Trump of sexually assaulting them.

After over 30 years of dawning dynamic measures amid the Hip-Hop, R&B, and Pop music genres, Teddy Riley will be honored on the Hollywood Walk of Fame receiving the official prestigious star.

Despite glowing reviews from critics, ratings were less than impressive, and NBC cancelled it after only two seasons. However, by special arrangement with LBS Communications , MGM revived the series for first-run syndication in the fall of , where it continued for four more seasons, with the last first-run episode airing in the US on May 18, Ira Steven Behr wrote twelve episodes of the series. He recalled the series thusly: We had no one looking over our shoulder. We got to do some wonderfully bizarre things on the show, and the only time they gave us any trouble was the last show I was going to write after I knew we were cancelled. It was going to be Road Warrior meets Fame. It was a show that takes place in the future, and you could only sing for the state. It was a fascist society, and we were going to have motorcycles going through the school and have Iggy Pop as the guest star. It was great, and I was in the midst of writing the episode when somehow MGM read somewhere that we planned to burn down the sets, which was a lie. We had one more after that, and they stopped me from writing it". A re-recorded version of the theme, using similar instrumentation to the track, was used in the TV series and sung by co-star Erica Gimpel , who played Coco Hernandez. Although Gimpel left the series midway through the third season after the show moved from NBC to first-run syndication in , her opening vocals were still heard on the show for two more seasons. An updated version of the song, featuring a modern, synthesized hard-rock flavor, was introduced in the fall of and performed by new cast member Loretta Chandler Dusty. This version ran for the final two seasons of Fame. It was performed by Erica Gimpel and Debbie Allen and co-written by Gary Portnoy who would go on to co-write and sing the theme from Cheers. There were four cast members from the original movie who appeared in the television series. Lee Curreri portrayed the character Bruno Martelli, an introverted musical genius. Gene Anthony Ray who portrayed Leroy Johnson, a tough hood from the projects with a natural talent for dance who muscles his way into an audition and wins. In the film, Leroy is also illiterate, but this was not addressed in the television series. Albert Hague who played teacher Benjamin Shorofsky, a German music teacher who constantly battled with Bruno Martelli over music styles. And the final cast member from the film was Debbie Allen who played dance instructor Lydia Grant. Although Lydia only appeared briefly in the movie, her character was expanded in the series. There were also several characters carried over from the movie, played by different actors. The Montgomery character was changed for TV and was no longer gay. English teacher, Elizabeth Sherwood was played in the film by actress Anne Meara , but in the series was played by actress Carol Mayo Jenkins. The character of Ralph Garci Tommy Aguilar inheriting the role played in the film by Barry Miller appeared in the first episode of the TV version, but was metamorphosed into the character of Danny Amatullo. The character Doris Schwartz, played by Valerie Landsburg, was in the series while the character Doris Finsecker appeared in the film version and was portrayed by Maureen Teefy. Since , reruns of Fame have been airing in the United States on the arts-focused cable network Ovation. Actress , director and choreographer Debbie Allen , who had a small role in the motion picture but played a major character in the television version, also won several awards.

SOURCE Hall of Fame inductees are nominated and inducted based upon peer recommendations, biographies, accomplishments, reputation, the number of years each individual has worked within the entertainment industry, and level of community involvement.

Synopsis[edit] The work begins with a poem in which Chaucer speculates on the nature and causes of dreams. He claims that he will tell his audience about his "wonderful" dream "in full. The first book begins when, on the night of the tenth of December, Chaucer has a dream in which he is inside a temple made of glass, filled with beautiful art and shows of wealth. After seeing an image of Venus , Vulcan , and Cupid , he deduces that it is a temple to Venus. Chaucer explores the temple until he finds a brass tablet recounting the Aeneid. Chaucer finishes recounting the Aeneid from the brass tablet, and then decides to go outside to see if he can find anyone who can tell him where he is. He finds that outside the temple is a featureless field, and prays to Christ to save him from hallucination and illusion. He looks up to the sky, and sees a golden eagle that begins to descend towards him, marking the end of the first book. When the second book begins, Chaucer has attempted to flee the swooping eagle, but is caught and lifted up into the sky. Chaucer faints, and the eagle rouses him by calling his name. The eagle explains that he is a servant of Jove , who seeks to reward Chaucer for his unrewarded devotion to Venus and Cupid by sending him to the titular House of the goddess Fame , who hears all that happens in the world. Chaucer is skeptical that Fame could possibly hear everything in the world, prompting the eagle to explain how such a thing happens. The concept of the natural abode was an explanation for how gravity functions: The eagle gives further evidence of this by comparing sound to a ripple. Later, the Eagle offers to tell Chaucer more about the stars , but Chaucer declines, saying he is too old. They arrive at the foot of the House of Fame at the beginning of the third book, and Chaucer describes what he sees. The House of Fame is built atop a massive rock that, upon closer inspection, turns out to be ice inscribed with the names of the famous. He notices many other names written in the ice that had melted to the point of illegibility, and deduces that they melted because they were not in the shadow of the House of Fame. Chaucer climbs the hill, and sees the House of Fame, and thousands of mythological musicians still performing their music. He enters the palace itself, and sees Fame. He describes her as having countless tongues, eyes, and ears, to represent the spoken, seen, and heard aspects of fame. She also has partridge wings on her heels, to represent the speed at which fame can move. Chaucer observes Fame as she metes out fame and infamy to groups of people who arrive, whether or not they deserve or want it. At one point, a man who is most likely Herostratus asks for infamy, which Fame grants to him. In a valley outside of the house, Chaucer sees a large, rapidly spinning wicker house that he guesses to be at least miles in length. The poem ends at this point, and the identity of this man remains a mystery. The Columns of Fame[edit] The House of Fame is held up by a number of large columns, and standing atop them are a number of famous poets and scholars, who carry the fame of their most prominent stories on their shoulders. Josephus , a scholar of Jewish history, standing on a column of lead and iron and holding the fame of the Jewish people. He is accompanied by seven others, unnamed, who help him carry the burden. Chaucer notes that the reason the column is of lead and iron is because they wrote of battles as well as wonders, and iron is the metal of Mars and lead is the metal of Saturn. On an iron pillar, holding up the fame of Troy: Chaucer notes some ill-will between them. Virgil on a column of brightly tinned iron. Ovid on a column of copper. Sir Lucan on a column of stern iron, holding the fame of Julius and Pompey , accompanied by a number of Roman historians. Claudian on a pillar of sulfur, holding the fame of Pluto and Proserpine. Other scholars have put forth the alternative hypothesis that the man of great authority is Elijah, or another of the Hebrew prophets. The poem contains the earliest known uses in the English language of the terms galaxy and Milky Way:
