Reduce the risk of these injuries by following the tips below: If you are working with flammable or combustible materials, keep them away from open flames and sparks. Employees working with flammable or combustible materials, or near open flames, should wear flame-resistant clothing. Do not touch equipment until you are certain it is not hot. If a worker suffers a thermal burn injury, move him or her to a safe place. If clothing is on fire, help the person to stop, drop and roll until the flames are completely extinguished. If the burn is mild first-degree , apply cool water to the injury, elevate the body part, and give the person water to drink. If the person has sustained a second-degree burn, do not apply cool water. Simply elevate the body part and give the person water to drink. If the burn is more serious third-degree , do not apply cool water, do apply a sterile, nonstick dressing to the wound, treat the person for shock, and seek medical attention immediately. To prevent chemical burns, ensure that chemicals are stored and labeled correctly. Wear appropriate safety gear when working with dangerous chemicals. Before beginning a job working with chemicals, make sure that you know the location of a fire extinguisher, first aid kit, and nearest eye wash station. Immediately remove contaminated clothing if you come into contact with dangerous chemicals. Overhead power lines should be marked. If a worker suffers an electrical burn or injury, turn off the power. Do not touch the injured worker until you are sure the power has been turned off. A look at some of the events around the world: Russia More than 1 million people came out on the streets in Moscow to march in the traditional May Day parade. Over recent years, the parade became a highly orchestrated show of power by Russian authorities and the ruling United Russia party, with the demonstrators refraining from criticizing the government. Getty Several hundred people braved the rainy weather and joined the column marching across St. About 10,000 people rallied in Moscow on Monday to protest the blocking of Telegram. Turkey declared Taksim Square off-limits to May Day celebrations citing security concerns. Roads leading to the square were blocked and police allowed only small groups of labor union representatives to lay wreaths at a monument there. Still, a group of some 25 people, chanting "Taksim cannot be off limits on May 1" tried to push their way into the square but were rounded up by riot police. In 2013, 34 people were killed there during a May Day event when shots were fired into the crowd from a nearby building. Greece Thousands of Greeks are marching through central Athens in at least three separate May Day demonstrations. Museums were also shut while ferries remain were tied up in port and public transport operated on a reduced schedule in strikes marking labor day. Getty Police said at least 7,000 people were at the first demonstration in Athens, which was organized by a communist party-led union. The protesters marched by parliament and headed up a major avenue to the United States Embassy. Trains, the suburban railway, urban trolleys and ferries to and from the islands suspended operations for the day, while buses and the Athens metro system were operating on reduced schedules. The demonstration in Madrid was among the biggest, with thousands rallying behind the slogan "Time to win. Pepe Alvarez, the secretary general of UGT, the other main union in Spain, said that meeting the demands of feminists, youths and pensioners are necessary to "redistribute wealth" in the country. The police estimated the crowd at 10,000 people. The union members also demanded that the government scrap the restructuring of the shipbuilding and automobile industries, and reform the huge conglomerates that dominate the South Korean economy. Indonesia About 10,000 workers from various labor groups rallied near the presidential palace in Jakarta to voice their demands. Most of the workers came from Jakarta and nearby suburbs, but some traveled from West Java and Surabaya. The protesters urged the government to avoid outsourcing, and to raise their wages. They also asked the government to stop foreign laborers from working in Indonesia, saying it decreases employment opportunities for local workers. The workers wanted to march to the National Assembly to urge lawmakers to help them address labor-related concerns, but the group was stopped by riot police. This standard also ensures a consistent measure of TBSA. If a patient is transferred from one medical facility to another, consistency is vital. How does the Rule of Nines work? Here is quick rundown: Rule of Nines for burns on adults: These 11 areas are: They have proportionally larger heads and shorter legs than adults. The entire surface of the body is divided into 7 areas, with these percentages: This is because injury to these areas is more dangerous than injuries to other areas. This includes the face and neck, groin and buttocks, and joints. A person has burns covering the entire front of the left arm. The TBSA is 4. A person has burns covering the top half of the back of the left arm and the top of the back. The TBSA is 2. A person has burns covering the groin, the entire front of the right leg, the top half of the front of the left leg and the top of the back of the right leg. ## Chapter 5 : What is the Rule of Nines for burns?

For they were acting as babes, being swayed by the prejudices and passions of the unregenerate life out of which they had been born, and to which they were not wholly dead, even after all this time. Servants through whom you believed, even as the Lord gave opportunity to each one. However, it was God who made them effective in this work; He was causing the growth. Paul, Apollos or God? The only difference between these co-workers will be in their reward: For remember, it is God who gave the increase. But each man must be careful how he builds on it. For no man can lay a foundation other than the one which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Paul cautions those builders who follow him to be careful how they build on this foundation. For the foundation he laid is Jesus Christ. He is not only the only foundation upon which the universal church rests Matt Paul laid the foundation of the church of God at Corinth through teaching the gospel. Likewise, those who build on it will do so through what they teach. Be careful, says the apostle, how you build. In other words, you must keep on teaching the doctrine of Christ and not those derived by men; you must keep on speaking the whole gospel and not just those parts that make others feel comfortable. Though this latter view is popular, it ignores the context and must be rejected. The gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw refer to the materials that make up the structure; namely, the people who believe through the preaching of men like Paul and Apollos. The gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, and the straw are two kinds of building material. One is fireproof, while the other burns. These building materials represent two classes of disciples a teacher may have. The task of the teacher is to teach the whole counsel of God to the disciples so they might be equipped to withstand fiery trials through which they must eventually pass. Through such teaching the wood, hay and straw can become the gold, silver and precious stones. However, if the teacher does not teach whole message of God and if he does not live this message before the people, he will be a careless builder. If his work does not endure, he will suffer loss; but he himself shall be saved. But what is his reward if his work passes through the fire and endures? It is knowing that those whom he taught and encouraged have remained faithful. This will be his reward in this present life and on that final day when we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ. This is a discouragement to him, but it does not affect his salvation. If his doctrines have not been true; if he has had mistaken views of piety; if he has nourished feelings which he thought were those of religion; and inculcated practices which, however well meant, are not such as the gospel produces; if he has fallen into error of opinion, feeling, practice, however conscientious, yet he shall suffer loss. He shall suffer loss -: That which he supposed would be regarded as acceptable by the Judge, and rewarded accordingly, shall be stripped away, and shown to be unfounded and false; and in consequence, he shall not obtain those elevated rewards which he anticipated. This, compared with what he expected, may be regarded as a loss. It shall be a detriment to him to all eternity. The effects shall be felt in all his residence in heaven - not producing misery but attending him with the consciousness that he might have been raised to superior bliss in the eternal abode - The phrase here literally means, "he shall be mulcted. But he himself shall be saved - The apostle all along has supposed that the true foundation was laid 1 Corinthians 3: There may be much error, and many false views of religion, and much imperfection, still the man that is building on the true foundation shall be safe. His errors and imperfections shall be removed, and he may occupy a lower place in heaven, but he shall be safe. This passage has greatly perplexed commentators; but probably without any good reason. The apostle does not say that Christians will be doomed to the fires of purgatory; nor that they will pass through fire; nor that they will be exposed to pains and punishment at all; but he "simply carries out the figure" which he commenced, and says that they will be saved, as if the action of fire had been felt on the edifice on which he is speaking. That is, as fire would consume the wood, hay, and stubble, so on the great Day everything that is erroneous and imperfect in Christiana shall be removed, and that which is true and genuine shall be preserved as if it had passed through fire. Their whole character and opinions shall be investigated; and that which is good shall be approved; and that which is false and erroneous be removed. The idea is not that of a man whose house is burnt over his head and who escapes through the flames, nor that of a man who is subjected to the pains and fires of purgatory; but that of a man who had been spending his time and strength to little purpose; who had built, indeed, on the true foundation, but who had reared so much on it which was unsound, and erroneous, and false, that he himself would be saved with great difficulty, and with the loss of much of that reward which he had expected, as if the fire had passed over him and his works. The simple idea, therefore, is, that that which is genuine and valuable in his doctrines and works, shall be rewarded, and the man shall be saved; that which is not sound and genuine, shall be removed, and he shall suffer loss. Some of the fathers, indeed, admitted that this passage taught that all people would be subjected to the action of fire in the great conflagration with which the world

shall close; that the wicked shall be consumed; and that the righteous are to suffer, some more and some less, according to their character. On passages like this, the Roman Catholic doctrine of purgatory is based. But we may observe: The interpretation stated above is the natural interpretation, and one which the passage will not only bear, but which it demands. The idea of danger and peril is, indeed, in this text; but the idea of personal salvation is retained and conveyed. The 29 burned employees ranged in age from 16 to 60 years median: Seventeen employees sustained grease burns. Five workers were burned on the face; seven, the hand s ; and eight, the feet; the remainder were burned on other parts of the body. Follow-up workplace investigations by CDH identified several specific incidents associated with use of deep fryers, particularly older models, that increase the risk for inadvertent contact with hot grease: In February , the Minnesota Department of Health MDH was notified of a work-related burn sustained by a year-old waitress in a delicatessen who had slipped on a wet floor. As she fell, she stepped into a bucket of hot grease that had been placed on the floor while the grease in a deep fryer was being replaced. She was hospitalized for 3 days and required surgery for split-thickness skin grafting. She suffered permanent scarring of her burned ankle. On July 24, , MDH was notified of a work-related burn sustained by a year-old crew cook in a fast-food restaurant. He was pushing a container of hot grease from the kitchen to the outside for filtration. When he reached to hold open a door, the container slipped, the lid fell off, and hot grease spilled over much of his body. He sustained second- and third-degree burns to his ankles, arms, chest, and face and was hospitalized for 2 weeks. Scarring occurred on all burned areas. To reduce risks associated with use of deep fryers, newer-model fryers have exhaust vents in closer proximity to the fryer and built-in grease filters 5. Employers should replace existing deep fryers with newer models equipped with these features, as well as with improved grease-disposal systems, automatic food-lowering devices, and associated vat covers. In addition, floor surfaces in restaurant kitchens should be slip-resistant and cleaned often with grease-cutting solutions. When older-model deep fryers are used, employers should develop written safety guidelines for maintenance and routine operating procedures and ensure that employees adhere to the requirements; employees should receive formal training regarding these guidelines. In particular, no employee should be

required or allowed to 1 stand on top of a hot deep fryer to clean ventilation components, 2 roll a fryer containing hot grease, 3 lift and carry a metal receptacle containing hot grease, or 4 work in proximity to hot fryers when the floor is wet.
