At the time of W. In , he was awarded the Gold Medal from the Institution of Civil Engineers for a paper he presented on his completed project. The family returned to Great Britain for the boys education, and lived near Grantown-on-Spey in Scotland , where Beckett loved wandering the hills and glens of Speyside. Beckett won innumerable cups and medals for boxing, bayonet fighting, sabres and foils at the Naval Colleges, and later in the fleet and at the Royal Naval and Military Tournament. After two years as a midshipman Beckett was promoted to Acting Sub-Lieutenant and he was also playing fullback in the Navy Rucker team. When HMS Amphion , the first Royal Naval ship to be sunk during the First World War , [1] was going down, Beckett was aboard searching for survivors, and became the hero of a tale often told. Amphion blew up and Beckett found himself sailing through the air amongst a cloud of bric-a-brac, and amongst it was the wardroom clock, of which Beckett observed the time as he tumbled through the air and into the sea. During his time on Legion, Beckett developed a reputation as an excellent seaman, and a practitioner of fine nautical skills and knot-work. Kipling was very interested in the Royal Navy, and used Beckett as a source of information for his naval classic, "Sea Warfare". He found they had various common interests, including a connection to India, where both men had been born. Operated by a crew of three, it was capable of It also had four. While in command of CMB No. He organised a temporary base and established liaison with French naval authorities and with the air force. Beckett was in command of a Divisional CMB attack on German destroyers at Zeebrugge on 7 April , as a result one was sunk and one very seriously damaged. He continued in that position until after Armistice occurred on 11 November Beckett was in command of CMB No. During this time he worked with the military on land , as a Lewis Gun Officer, and on mine clearance duties on the river. He was left in charge to destroy material at their up-river base at Troitsa, and to cover the retirement of military forces. During this time he salvaged SS Edith and towed her to Dover , but his salvage claim was disallowed. Beckett was made Lieutenant-Commander while serving aboard Ramillies. The purpose of the cruise was for King George V to recuperate after a period of serious illness. During the cruise Beckett had the opportunity to spend time with the Royal family, and upon the completion of their cruise, King George V presented Beckett with a Member of the Royal Victorian Order MVO for the services he had given during their most enjoyable cruise. In they wed, and were deeply in love. They settled at her home, St Regulus, near Southampton , and soon after Beckett was made a Commander. Beckett had served under Sir John Kelly in the past, and the two were on very good terms. Kelly felt there was no better man for the job than Beckett, who had been made a Captain by this stage, and was in command of the destroyer HMS Winchester. This was an unusual job for a junior Captain, but one to which Beckett was well fitted. War was on the horizon and a strong man was needed to tighten things up. Beckett was a seadog, and was not happy to be serving on land. When the opportunity of the Captaincy of the York-class heavy cruiser Exeter became available, Beckett jumped at the opportunity. She was receiving an extensive refit at Devonport Dockyard following her participation in the Battle of the River Plate. Beckett was appointed captain of the Exeter during her refit and supervised the whole process. These wounds, particularly his chest, finally took their toll on him and he was sent to have chest X-rays. After a month of ill-health, through which he persevered at the dockyard, Beckett left on Friday, 7 March , for the last time. On the night of Saturday 8 March, he had great pain in his chest and stomach. On the morning of Sunday 9 March, two doctors saw him at home and he was taken to Saltash Hospital for an exploratory operation. He had the operation at 3. His wife Gladys saw him at 7pm and stayed with him, but at 10pm he lost consciousness and he finally died at 3. Beckett is remembered on the war memorial in Grantown-on-Spey in Morayshire , Scotland. Beckett received the thanks of the Admiralty for devices he had designed e. Havant and Waterloo Warblington Cemetery, sec. Incomparably charismatic and ferociously skilled in the art of combat and deception, V ignites a revolution when he urges his fellow citizens to rise up against tyranny and oppression. However, it pays this homage without relying on it. Intense performances of Hugo Weaving as V and Natalie Portman as Evey Hammond are punctuated with some dry humour, which makes this film a cinematic page-turner. It is a film that has already gathered a cult following but its acclaim should be so much wider. Vividly and veraciously virtuous, it is, quite simply, amazing. Capitals that time, see? Anyone who has read *Nineteen Eighty-Four* by the immortal George Orwell will certainly note the incredible similarities - totalitarian Britain rears its ugly head once more. Known simply as "V" played immaculately by the ever-impressive Hugo Weaving and seen only ever wearing a Guy Fawkes mask, the sophisticated, suave and very eloquent gentleman you might see on the cover is seeking revenge, but mostly a future for his people, that is not burdened by fear and overpowering intimidation. The other individual you might spot on the cover is Evey, who has the foundations of a successful activist, but requires a little help from V to realise herself and her true potential. The film goes together excellently, and although nothing seems to be happening through the middle, I found myself not caring at all, and still very interested. The music is powerful and moving, and the climax is very well-fitting. All in all I found the film very pleasurable indeed. Do yourself a big favour, and watch this film! One thing I must comment on is how disgustingly Americans portray Britons. Seriously, one person calls "V" "chummey". Are they being serious? When the hell has anyone used that phrase in the history of mankind? Britain, America and the Nazis and for many Jews orthodox or non-practising the Swastika of Nazism and the Israeli Hexagram of Zionism are interchangeable. Simon Hawke (born September 30,) is an American author of mainly science fiction and fantasy novels. He was born Nicholas Valentin Yermakov, but began writing as Simon Hawke in and later changed his legal name to Hawke.

Jango Fett Jango Fett was the greatest bounty hunter of the last days of the Old Republic- at least, until he suffered his demise at the hands of Jedi Knight Mace Windu. Having been hired by Count Dooku a decade before the Clone Wars, he was the original genetic source for the Clone Army of the Galactic Republic, and demanded to the Kamino cloners that he would be given an unaltered clone: Jango was a great bounty hunter, that had the capacity of being a good adversary to trained and disciplined Jedi like Obi-Wan Kenobi. He was named after the character of the Spaghetti Western, Django. Mace Windu Portrayed by the great Samuel L. Jackson, Mace Windu was the only Jedi Knight known to have had a purple lightsaber. Windu was a pupil of Yoda, an excellent swordsman, and one of the most dogmatic Jedi of the Order. His lack of trust in Anakin played a large role in his fall to the dark side, and died getting thrown off a balcony by force lightning. As the main protagonist of the highly successful animated series, Ahsoka went from being a brash and inexperienced kid into a more-mature for her age young Jedi. By introducing a female lead into Star Wars, it opened the doors for far more women to get into being fans of sci-fi and epic space operas. She sadly leaves the Jedi Order at the end of Season 5. He goes off in a vendetta against Mace Windu during the Clone Wars for the murder of his father, an arc in the show that made the character have some sense of morality. He stands as a bit of a grey area character, and later off goes into capture Han Solo in order to deliver him to Jabba the Hutt. Boba does all that with the help of Darth Vader and the Empire. He dies in the Sarlacc pit after Han Solo accidentally malfunctions his jet-pack. A cyborg who is part machine and part alien, Grievous was purposely destroyed by the Separatists and reconstructed by them in order to serve as the Supreme Commander of the Droid Army.
