Meanwhile flivver is an early 20th century coinage that refers to a small, cheap, and usually old automobile. The Fifth Amendment says: No person shall be held to answer for a capital or otherwise infamous crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a Grand Jury, except in cases arising in the land or naval forces, or in the Militia, when in actual service in time of War or public danger; nor shall any person be subject for the same offence, to be twice put in jeopardy of life or limb; nor shall be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness, against himself, nor be deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just compensation. In the evolution of human and humane law, it is expected that due process would remain as one of the good things about ancient custom and that the death penalty would go as one of the bad things about ancient custom. The death penalty has much in common with slavery. Slavery has been defined as "Social death. The death penalty is as obsolete in our modern world of jurisprudence as is slavery. One of the pending amendments the Constitution is an amendment to recognize slavery. That amendment deserves no serious thought, and the death penalty should join it in oblivion as a grim reminder of our barbarous history. A former Court understood the barbarism of the death penalty and banned it from our system of jurisprudence, allowing us to join the civilized nations of the world. Our republicanism is immoral and a disgrace to humanity. Death is a normal consequence of life. In the normal course of human events people will kill each other, out of passion or otherwise. Murder is not a desired attribute of modern society. Instituting the death penalty does not exert the social control necessary to prevent or diminish murder. The death rate may actually be higher in states with the death penalty. It is one thing for one person to kill another for any reason whatever it is another thing for the State to kill a person in cold premeditated blood. The State is not a person, not even in the sense of a corporation being a person. The State is a huge powerful mechanism with untold authority that is supposed to be expended in the furtherance of the welfare and well being of the people of the nation. The State does not have a mind or a personality. The State can not, exhibit emotion, like anger or love. People can do that but not the State. The State should be in equipoise. It should not exhibit anything but the processes for a humane ecosystem. In no way should the State carry out the emotional wishes of any of its adherents. The State is or should be an impersonal mechanism for carrying out the business of government. The death penalty serves no useful purpose. It does not deter crime. It does nothing for the victim who is already dead. And the State should not be used as the instrument of vengeance for the bereaved. The State shares none of these

attributes with people. The State lives forever and has great power. The State is not a person and should not attempt to act like one. The State is not our father or mother, nor an authority figure of any kind. Judges are instruments of the State when they act as judges, but they have no right to represent their personal interests. They must represent the law. Our government is a government of law not a government of people. The modern death penalty has much in common with the Code of Hammurabi. In the Code of Hammurabi, the punishment for equivalent crimes was different depending upon the social status of the criminal. The higher the criminal in social status, the less the penalty. The same is true today with respect to the death penalty. A rich person with a team of good lawyers will seldom if ever be defeated by the public prosecutor, and in many instances the defendant goes free, is found not guilty, is freed on a technicality, or receives a reduced sentence. Defendants with high class lawyers are not executed. Roger Coleman had a rookie lawyer. Many defendants are freed on technicalities, which infuriates the law and order crowd. Aside from the death penalty being a barbaric practice, it lacks the essential quality of equity. Ecological equity is the hallmark of a humane society, and it includes life as an unalienable right. Death is one of the few absolutes of our life. Death is irreversible and it has no mechanism for compensation of the dead. The dead can no longer plead their case nor can they assert any right or claim. In the world of an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth, might was right. If a wrong was committed requiring the forfeiture of life, the contending parties settled it among themselves. The system was barbaric but there was equity, the sort that goes with animal morality. Under our present system of human morality, if the judge and jury are wrong, if the Appeals Court or the Supreme Court is wrong and the person is executed there is no equitable recourse. The premeditated execution of a person has no consequences for the people who made the error. If there were consequences upon the finding that the victim was innocent, then the judge and jury should be found guilty of homicide. If the suspected murderer is incarcerated and later found to be innocent, compensation is possible. If the suspect is never found to be innocent and dies in prison the terms of the law will have been carried out. If the murder was a crime of passion as most are and rehabilitation is possible, parole at some time is feasible. With the death penalty none of the above is possible. The death penalty is just another symptom of a sick nation, a nation with morning in America sickness. We are a nation divided by class and race, and the death penalty is a manifestation of both those conditions. Our middle class was alive with rising expectations and people as a whole firmly believed they would leave their children a better world. The numbers of poor were being reduced dramatically and it was not taking a lot of money. As a matter of fact, the nation was running surpluses. We need some serious analysis of the role our redeemer presidents played in this sorry tale. What was Watergate really about? What about the October Surprise? Did it really happen and is that why Reagan won? What part did Bush play? Was it really an extension of the October Surprise? What about Bush and Saddam Hussein? Did Bush sucker him into the Persian Gulf War? Why lower taxes and increase spending? Why lie about the Russian threat? How did the climate change so drastically in so short a time? The V-Cube 7 in a scrambled state Issue with corners in a large cube The V-Cube 7 in solved state The puzzle consists of unique miniature cubes "cubies" on the surface. Six of these the central tiles of the six faces are attached directly to the internal "spider" frame and are fixed in position relative to one another. The V-Cube 6 uses essentially the same mechanism, except that on the latter the central rows, which hold the rest of the pieces together, are completely hidden. Each piece or quintet of edge pieces shows a unique color combination, but not all combinations are present for example, there is no piece with both red and orange sides, since red and orange are on opposite sides of the solved Cube. Currently, the V-Cube 7 is produced with white plastic as a base, with red opposite orange, blue opposite green, and yellow opposite black. Verdes and other manufacturers also sell cubes with black plastic and a white face, with the other colors remaining the same, and solid plastic versions with the plastic the colour itself and no stickers. The fixed black or white center piece is branded with the logo of the manufacturer, which is V on cubes by Verdes. Unlike the flat-sided V-Cube 6, the V-Cube 7 is noticeably rounded. This departure from a true cube shape is necessary, since the mechanism used on this puzzle would not function properly with layers of identical thickness. Other means such as magnets would be required. The V-Cube 6 and V-Cube 7 both solve the problem by using thicker outer layers. The rounded shape of the V-Cube 7 results in corner stickers that are similar in size to the center stickers, which helps hide the unequal thickness. Cubes from other manufacturers can be found with rounded or flat sides, but all use thicker outer layers. Any permutation of the corners is possible, including odd permutations. Seven of the corners can be independently rotated, and the orientation of the eighth depends on the other seven, giving $8!$ There are movable centers, consisting of six sets of 24 pieces each. Within each set there are four centers of each color. Centers from one set cannot be exchanged with those from another set. Each set can be arranged in $24!$ Assuming that the four centers of each color in each set are indistinguishable, the number of permutations of each set is reduced to $24!$ The reducing factor comes about because there are $24^4!$ This is raised to the sixth power because there are six colors. The total number of permutations of all movable centers is the permutations of a single set raised to the sixth power, $24!$ There are 60 edge pieces, consisting of 12 central, 24 intermediate, and 24 outer edges. The central edges can be flipped but the rest cannot because the internal shape of the pieces is asymmetrical, nor can an edge from one set exchange places with one from another set. The five edges in each matching quintet are distinguishable, since corresponding non-central edges are mirror images of each other. There are ways that they can be flipped, since the orientation of the twelfth edge depends on the preceding eleven. Any permutation of the intermediate and outer edges is possible, including odd permutations, giving $24!$ This gives a total number of permutations of $8.$
