The standard treatment for patients with early-stage cervical cancer has been radical hysterectomy. However, for women interested in future fertility, radical trachelectomy is now considered a safe and feasible option. The use of minimally invasive surgical techniques to perform this procedure has recently been reported. We report the first case of a laparoscopic radical trachelectomy performed in a developing country. The patient is a nulligravid, y-old female with stage IB1 adenocarcinoma of the cervix who desired future fertility. She underwent a laparoscopic radical trachelectomy and bilateral pelvic lymph node dissection. The operative time was min, and the estimated blood loss was mL. There were no intraoperative or postoperative complications. The final pathology showed no evidence of residual disease, and all pelvic lymph nodes were negative. At 20 mo of follow-up, the patient is having regular menses but has not yet attempted to become pregnant. There is no evidence of recurrence. Laparoscopic radical trachelectomy with pelvic lymphadenectomy in a young woman who desires future fertility may also be an alternative technique in the treatment of early cervical cancer in developing countries. However, for women interested in future fertility, a radical trachelectomy is now considered a safe and feasible option. The abdominal radical trachelectomy was introduced by Smith and colleagues in The abdominal approach allows surgeons who have not had extensive training in radical vaginal surgery to perform this procedure. Our group previously showed that the abdominal radical trachelectomy is also a safe and feasible procedure in the setting of a developing country. On physical examination, the cervix showed no gross lesions. Colposcopy was performed and biopsy showed grade 2 endocervical adenocarcinoma with 6mm of invasion. No conization was performed given the results of invasive adenocarcinoma in the biopsy. On palpation, the vaginal fornices and parametria did not have any evidence of disease. A diagnosis of a stage IB1 endocervical adenocarcinoma was made. The patient was offered a radical hysterectomy, and was also given the option of a radical trachelectomy given her age and nulliparity. The patient was also given the option of a laparoscopic approach to perform this procedure. The patient did not undergo a preoperative MRI due to limited access to this technology for some patients in Colombia. However, when possible, we consider that MRI should remain the modality of choice to evaluate upper cervical involvement in patients due to undergo a radical trachelectomy. The patient underwent a laparoscopic radical trachelectomy and pelvic lymph node dissection in June The abdomen was insufflated using CO2 with a pressure of 15mm Hg. We used 5 trocars Ethicon , the first mm was placed at the supraumbilical puncture site, two 5-mm trocars each were placed in the right and left lower quadrants, respectively, and two 5-mm trocars each were placed in the right and left upper quadrants at the level of the umbilicus, respectively. The patient was placed in a steep Trendelenburg position. Rectovaginal spaces were entered and widened by blunt dissection. Paravesical and pararectal spaces were developed. Pelvic retroperitoneal space was dissected. The round ligaments were preserved. Systematic bilateral pelvic lymphadenectomy internal iliac, external iliac, and obturator was performed. Intraoperative frozen section evaluation of the lymph nodes did not reveal any evidence of disease. Uterine arteries were coagulated and cut at the level of hypogastric artery with a bipolar coagulator Aesculap AdTec bipolar, B. The bladder peritoneum was incised and the vesicouterine space was dissected from the upper vagina. The ureters were freed from the peritoneal attachments and parametrium-paracolpium. Bladder was sharply dissected from parametria exposing bladder pillars, which were coagulated and resected at the posterior wall of the bladder. Uterosacral ligaments were coagulated and cut. A monopolar hook Karl Storz, Tuttlingen, Germany was used to amputate the cervix 1cm below the isthmus. The specimen including cervix, bilateral parametria, and upper vaginal margin was removed through the vagina. The frozen section biopsy revealed no involvement of the superior margin with invasive or in situ adenocarcinoma. Seromuscular edge of resected uterine corpus was fixed to the proximal vaginal vault with a continuous running suture using 2â€™0 polyglactin Vicryl. This was

performed using a vaginal approach. There was no cerclage placed. We do not routinely place a cerclage, because we feel that it may add to the risk of immediate postoperative complications, particularly cerclage erosion through the site of the anastomosis. In our practice, patients who are able to conceive after radical trachelectomy routinely undergo pelvic ultrasound, and the cerclage is placed when the patient is pregnant. A Foley catheter 8 French was introduced vaginally and placed into the uterus. This was done to decrease the potential for scarring of the residual cervix. This was left in place for 9 d and then removed. The operative time was min. The estimated blood loss was mL. Bowel activity was re-established on the second postoperative day, and the patient was discharged home on that same day. The Foley catheter was removed on postoperative day 9. The patient has been voiding spontaneously since that time. The final pathology revealed adenocarcinoma in situ in the specimen with no evidence of residual invasive disease. There were 10 pelvic lymph nodes removed and all were negative for malignancy. At 20 mo of follow-up, the patient is without evidence of disease. She is having regular menses, but has not yet attempted pregnancy. To date, 44 cases of laparoscopic abdominal radical trachelectomy had been reported in 7 articles in the literature, including the present report Table 1. In those patients, the operative times were min and min, respectively including time for frozen sections , and the vaginal procedures took 65 min and 58 min, respectively. No major intraoperative complications occurred. Blood loss reported was mL for the first patient and mL for the second. Hospital stay was 18 and 7 d, respectively. Pelvic lymph node count was 20 for the first patient and 50 for the second patient, both of them without tumor involvement. Both women were doing well with regular menstruation and no evidence of recurrence at 12 mo and 9 mo, respectively.

Introduction The College of Wooster is located in the 16th Congressional District of Ohio and was designated a selective depository for U. Selective depositories are subject to and strive to comply with the Depository Library Program 44 U. In July , the government information collection contained more than , titles , pieces in paper, fiche, CD-ROM, floppy disk, and other electronic formats , most of which have been entered in the online public access catalog of the library. These materials provide both current and historical information on topics of general interest, the federal government, and subjects relating to it. The library is committed to the overarching principle of providing free and unrestricted public access to government information regardless of format or mode of provision. The primary user group is the college community at all levels. Junior and senior students, especially those in political science, international relations, economics and business economics, sociology, and history are among the heaviest users of the collection for both coursework and the three-semester required independent study component for all students, which culminates in a senior thesis. High school students researching term papers, preparing for speech competitions or for the science fair also use the government information collection regularly. Government publications are selected for the collection based upon The College of Wooster curriculum, faculty and student research interests, the Independent Study Program, and the needs of the administration, the staff and the community. Selection General priorities and limitations governing selection of government publications include: Strong subject areas, both current and retrospective, will receive continuing support. Areas of particular strength and emphasis in the collection will continue to be supported with the selection of documents in those areas through the depository library system. Such areas include, but are not limited to, statistics--both economic and social; Congressional hearings and papers, both retrospective and current; U. Duplicate copies will be acquired only for a few heavily used reference titles and where having a circulating copy would help e. Generally, we have little need to duplicate materials. Some titles are still available in both paper and online formats, and electronic access is noted in the catalog record. These titles are, for the most part, titles that are important to provide to our patrons in paper format and we consider the paper format to be our primary copy. As long as online sources are not always accessible and stable, it will be essential to insure permanent public access to all materials by maintaining archival copies in the appropriate format s in our library. Review of item number selections is a continuing process, with a zero-based review conducted at least once a year in a diligent effort to shape and prune our selection profile. Surveys and other announcements of new depository items available for selection are evaluated and decisions made in timely fashion. Choice of format for titles available in paper, microfiche, or other electronic formats will be determined by the nature of the information, the amount of space it will need, and its use in our collection. Titles not generally selected for our library are highly technical reports, pamphlets except Social Security Administration and National Park Service , most maps, general publications, handbooks, manuals, guides, posters, ephemeral material, and titles where frequency or size cannot be determined although subject matter is considered. A title missing and presumed lost, which has been identified through inventory or by other means, is searched and then if deemed important to replace, the title will be ordered through either G. Replacements are sought for damaged items if the title needs to be replaced and if repair is not possible. Superseded titles are weeded on a regular basis in accordance with the Instructions, Guidelines, and the List of Superseded Depository Documents issued by G. Withdrawal of documents which have been kept for the mandatory five-year retention period will be carefully considered on the basis of this collection development policy and will be carried out in accordance with the policy and procedures outlined in the Instructions. This cooperation may include cooperative cataloging and collection development, resource sharing and interlibrary loan, selective housing, training, reference service, and referrals. We, in turn, rely upon the subject specialization of the OARDC library and the more complete holdings of our regional full depository, the State Library of Ohio in Columbus, to supply us with titles we do not have through Interlibrary

Loan. Within The College of Wooster Libraries, we work closely with the rest of the library staff to provide reference service for patrons in the Government Information Department as well as for those using the reference and general collections. Because of our close proximity to the reference collection, it is not necessary to duplicate the supplementary and complementary sources from that collection in the Government Information Department. Several frequently used government publications e. Government Manual, Handbook of Labor Statistics are located in the government information section of the ready reference shelves adjacent to the central reference desk in the general reference area. The basic indexing tools for the government information collection are located on the main floor Gault 1 at the end of the reference collection, e. Government Publications and the Index to U. Government Periodicals, among others. Bound volumes are sent to Technical Services for preparation, including call number labels and tattle-tapes. Commercial binding is done on a selective basis and includes several periodical titles and monographs. Mending, tip-ins, pockets and other repairs to the U. Such items should be deemed to have long-term value to the collection and inappropriate for microformat replacement. For those items which are beyond repair and which need to be replaced, attempts will be made to find replacement copies commercial vendors or duplicate exchange See Guidelines. Phase box construction, preservation copying or other appropriate conservation measures will be used by the Technical Services staff to conserve those items which need protection but which can not be completely repaired or replaced, and are of permanent value to the collection. In the event of damage to and U. Reference works, certain periodical titles, other items which are used frequently, receive heavy use at the copier, or have permanent value to the collection are candidates for commercial binding. If possible, these materials will not be labeled, targeted, or bar-coded except on acid-free strips. Indexes and Bibliographies A continuing commitment is made to collect and make available governmental and commercial indexes and bibliographies in print or other electronic forms which will provide easier and more detailed access to government information. There are also a number of online indexing databases for government information, provided through the Government Resources web page or the Library web page under Databases by Title. Every effort will be made to supply both historical and current coverage as stated in the Guidelines.

Interlibrary Loan When users from the college community need a government publication not held by The College of Wooster Libraries, we will make every effort to locate and borrow it following interlibrary loan procedures. Upon request, we lend government publications from the government information collection following The College of Wooster Libraries interlibrary loan procedures. In the case of out-of-state requests, we may suggest that the requesting library contact their regional or a depository library closer to them, unless it is evident that the requester has already tried these sources. Documents in microfiche format and portable microfiche readers circulate locally, and microfiche can be borrowed on interlibrary loan. Exceptions may be made in unusual circumstances. Maps Generally, we will not select item numbers that specifically distribute maps. Exceptions are the CIA maps, some agricultural maps, and several U. Depository maps and atlases are received and processed in the department and housed in the document map cases and a file cabinet on Andrews Lower 2. Most non-governmental atlases and geographical reference tools are housed in the Library of Congress reference and circulating collections. Circulation With few exceptions, materials in the government information collection circulate freely and under the same policies governing the entire library collections. Materials in the document reference collection, CD-ROMs and floppy disks, and document periodicals do not circulate. Exceptions may be made in unusual circumstances at the discretion of the librarians or staff. Public Service Policy Reference service for documents is provided by the Government Information Department staff, reference librarians and student reference assistants Monday-Thursday 8 a. These hours may vary during academic year breaks, in the summer months, and during summer school. Through our selective dissemination of information program SDI , we strive to make users aware of new and current government publications available in their areas of interest. Through on-going communication with the Wayne County Public Library, their library staff is able to refer patrons to the College of Wooster Libraries for the use of documents not available at the public library and we, in turn, can refer patrons to the public library collection in their areas of strength, such as business reference materials. The Government Information Department contributes to the library newsletter, when published. Our commitment to library instruction
